## IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Jesus captured in one pithy and punchy sentence the very heart, of the Torah (the Jewish Law) and the entire Old Testament prophets: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it, You shall love your neighbour as yourself". He brought together the first three of the Ten Commandments under his first commandment to love God, and the remaining seven commandments under his second commandment to love our neighbour.

Why does God require us to love not only him but also our neighbour? God has revealed himself to us as "a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness". He has shown mercy toward us by forgiving our sins, reconciling us to himself and adopting us as his beloved children. Because of the mercy and kindness that he has poured out upon us, we are invited, in our turn, to respond with love and heartfelt gratitude for all that he has done for us.

Since God the Father has shown mercy to every single person that he has created, he also requires that we do not withhold mercy and kindness from his children. If we really understand what God has done for us all, then we are compelled to imitate God's kindness and mercy towards everyone in our lives. If we fail to show mercy and kindness to those who are in reality our brothers and sisters, our hearts remain hardened, revealing that we have not truly grasped or understood what God has done for us. Furthermore, if we are harsh with one another, God's anger will blaze out against us.

In Jesus' parable about the unforgiving servant, the servant who owed his master a great deal of money and was released from his debt was himself bound to release his fellow servant from the very small debt that he owed him. Because he refused to do so, his master's anger blazed out against him. In the same way, we will provoke God's rebuke if we fail to show the same love, mercy and kindness toward our neighbour.

*Lord Jesus, help me to live out the heart of the commandments by loving God and my neighbour to the best of my ability.*
