IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

The account of the healing of the ten lepers is unique to the Gospel of Luke. The ten lepers, who due to the contagious nature of their virulent skin disease were not allowed to live in the village, had obviously heard of the powerful healings of Jesus. Luke records that, keeping their distance, they called out to Jesus, begging him to have mercy on them.

Preaching in the synagogue



at Nazareth, Jesus had spoken of the healing of the Syrian army commander Naaman, using this example to illustrate his mission beyond the confines of Judaism. While Naaman was healed by bathing in the Jordan, the healing of the ten lepers happens simply through their meeting with Jesus. In chapter five Jesus had touched and healed a leper. In this case he does not touch the lepers but rather sends them off to report to the priests, and "as they went, they were cleansed". In the second part of the story one leper, who happens to be a Samaritan, shows gratitude for his healing. In the parable of the Good Samaritan, reported in chapter ten, Jesus sets a Samaritan before us as an example of love of neighbour. The Samaritans were despised by the Jews because of religious differences, and yet it is the Samaritan who is the only one of the ten to show gratitude and praise God for his healing. What happened to the other nine? The man who was doubly an outcast, owing to his sickness and owing to his race, hears the words of salvation: "your faith has made you well". Is the Evangelist implying that the fullness of salvation was not given to the other nine? They received an extraordinary gift from Jesus, healing of the body, which was a sign of the coming kingdom of God, but they did not understand the sign and showed no gratitude for it. They received God's gifts without acknowledging the giver. "This one leper was given much more than the rest. Besides being healed of his leprosy, he was told by the Lord: "Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you." (St. Athanasius)


