"But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

IN THE GOSPEL TODAY

Jesus didn't come to abolish the law but to fulfil it. The Sermon on the Mount fulfils and completes the Ten Commandments. He underlines certain teachings - 'You have heard that it was said... ' (v.38) - and moves on to, 'But I say to you... ' (v.39). His new understanding expands, rather than reduces, the message of the law, making it more radical, yet, at the same time, more loving: 'Be perfect.. .as your heavenly Father is perfect' (v.48). That perfection includes loving both your friends and your enemies.

We're all called to a radical commitment to the good news, which involves being more generous, more prayerful and more willing to set aside our own needs for the good of others. But loving our enemies sounds like an impossible goal. Jesus is trying to show us the world as God sees it; for God, there's goodness within each person.

Our task is to make room for everyone, firstly because that's what God does, but secondly because we don't want to be in bondage to our resentments and thus fail to grow in our own relationship with the Lord of love. Our efforts will demand much of us spiritually and emotionally, but will pay dividends in a new kind of interior freedom. We've already seen this attitude lived out in Jesus himself, who shows us what God is like.

Jesus loved his enemies, and forgave those who mocked, scourged and crucified him. In this sense, we can say that the Sermon on the Mount predisposes us to live a life of self-giving, in imitation of Christ. Of course, we can't live like this, but God's grace enables us to live in a different way, that of the Spirit.

Love your enemy - it will drive them nuts!! Going the extra mile and being accommodating, kind and understanding drives those who oppose, resist and loathe us into confusion. Resentment, anger, revenge, etc., is the human way, whereas God's way is the way of the Spirit and where the Spirit is there's freedom.

Lord, help us to be attentive to your Word, to re-discover in Jesus the living God in our midst, and to radiate his love in our needy world.

Welcome to our parish community and our visitors today. Please note that on Wednesday we begin the Season of Lent. Ashes will be distributed at Mass at 9.15 a.m. and 7.30 p.m. On this day we are called to prayer, fasting and almsgiving: it is the human heart that good overcomes evil. None of us are too frail or housebound to be involved in this battle. None of us are so important that our real battle is on the externals of life. Our external life realises the reality in our heart. This is why religious are at the forefront of battle; why our prayer life is central to Lent. Temptation is overcome in prayer,

strengthened by scriptures, the word of God. One of the devil's more successful temptations is to convince you that you are no good at prayer so either play safe or do not bother. So many lives are wasted because, in a spirit of fear or false humility, we don't walk into the desert with Jesus when he calls us. So I challenge you, this Lent, to commit to private prayer, pray with your family, especially the Holy Rosary to ask for Mary's help to enter the desert. Reflect on the scriptures. Remember we are called everyday to walk the way of the cross. Every Friday at 7.00 p.m. during Lent we have the devotion of the Stations of the Cross. On Fridays abstain from meat. On Sundays we have Adoration of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Come to Jesus in the Sacrament of Confession. Above all persevere in our undertakings. During Lent Christ reveals his glorious body to us in the Transfiguration, he invites us to drink from him who is our living water, to trust in his healing power as the Light of the World who can help us to see, and to believe in him as our Resurrection and life. This Lent stand up to the temptation and fight against it whatever it might be. Jesus can only enter your heart and mind if you invite him to enter there with you and you stay there with him in helpless trust. Jesus we love you. Jesus we trust in you. Jesus you are my Lord and God. Jesus bring us safely through Lent to celebrate the Resurrection with mind and heart renewed.

Journey Home Threshold of Hope (Continued) IN BRIEF: THE SACRAMENT OF THE

EUCHARIST The signs of bread and wine.

At the heart of the Eucharist celebration are the bread and wine that, by the words of Christ and the invocation of the Holy Spirit, become Christ's Body and Blood. Faithful to the Lord's command the Church continues to do, in his memory and until his glorious return, what he did on the eve of his Passion: "He took bread " "He took the cup filled with wine " The signs of bread and wine become, in a way surpassing understanding, the Body and Blood of Christ; they continue also to signify the goodness of creation. Thus, in the Offertory we give thanks to the Creator for bread and wine, fruit of the "work of human hands," but above all as "fruit of the earth" and "of the vine" - gifts of the creator. The church sees in the gesture of the king priest Melchizedek, who brought out bread and wine," a prefiguring of her own offering.

Taking Liturgy Seriously & Eucharist

Ukrainian Emergency Winter Appeal

Ukrainians remain resilient despite the circumstances of the war, but they are in the throes of a harsh winter. For that reason, a new Emergency Winter Appeal was launched to provide food packages for the most vulnerable on the frontlines and in recently liberated regions in East and South Ukraine which is suffering from a severe humanitarian crisis.

The cost of one food parcel, providing enough food for two people for a week costs approximately £16. Each package contains the basics (grains, flour, pasta, meat and fish preserves, oil, canned vegetables, sugar, tea coffee, biscuits, etc.).

It is hoped that £160,000 can be raised allow the supply of 10,000 food parcels to those most in need and I ask that you and your

parishioners will consider supporting this Emergency Winter Appeal. Funds can be remitted to:
