

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

On Mount Tabor Saints Peter, Andrew and James witnessed the transfigured Lord with their own eyes. For a brief moment, they touched the beauty and light of heaven and knew something of the joy of paradise. We too can have a similar life-changing experience of God. But no one lives 'on Tabor' for long.

Human existence is a journey of faith and is lived more in darkness than in the fullness of light. Some experience moments of obscurity, whereas others experience profound darkness, such as Mother Teresa. While we're on earth our relationship with God develops more with listening than with seeing, and contemplation even takes place, thanks to the interior inner light within which God's Word illuminates.

Although she was the human creature closest to God, the Virgin Mary herself walked day after day as though she was on a pilgrimage of faith, keeping God's Word in her heart, whether through Scripture or through the recognized and accepted God's mysterious voice.

This is, therefore, the gift and commitment for us all during Lent: to listen to Christ, like Mary, for she learnt to contemplate and treasure the events of Jesus' life, even though grief and tribulation would pierce her soul. On this topic, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI declared, 'To listen to him in the word, preserved in Sacred Scripture. To listen to him in the very events of our lives, trying to read in them the messages of providence. To listen to him...in our brothers, especially in the little ones and the poor, for whom Jesus himself asked our concrete love. To listen to Christ and to obey his voice. This is the only way that leads to joy and love.'

To be a disciple is to be transformed, transfigured even, by the light of God's wisdom which we touch when we pray, read the sacred Scriptures, receive the gift of the Eucharist and serve our neighbour, especially the poor and marginalized.

Lord, grant me the gift to say, 'Great is the mystery of God'.



Welcome to our parish family and also to our visitors.

We are now in this important season of Lent. In last Sunday's gospel, we heard how Jesus was led into the wilderness to be tempted three times by the devil. Each time Jesus rebuked the devil. In the third temptation Jesus replied to the devil saying 'You must worship the Lord your God and serve him alone'. How do we resist the devil in our temptations?

In today's gospel we hear how Jesus took Peter, James and John to experience the happiness of being with Jesus in his glory as God. We all want to find happiness. That is why we want

to go to heaven. Heaven is a state of being - being with God, being with Jesus. How awesome is that to look forward to after death? Jesus gave the Apostles the grace to strengthen them for the forthcoming scandal of the Cross by giving them a glimpse of the glorious resurrection.

Every time we come to Mass, let us imagine ourselves like the apostles going up the mountain with Jesus. The Mass is always an experience of being with Jesus, being with God. Traditionally, the Mass is rightly referred to as 'heaven on earth'. God wants to reveal Himself in the ordinary ways and things that are familiar to us. He speaks to us and makes Himself present through the priest, the ministers, and the entire worshipping community - all ordinary men and women. In Holy Communion, we receive His Body and Blood in the form of simple bread and wine. As the servant Elisha said 'we do not see God's presence because our eyes need to be opened'.

So we pray, Lord open our eyes that we may see. St Paul tells us 'that we walk by faith, not by sight'. It is the eyes of faith that need to be opened so that we can discover God's hidden presence in the simple and ordinary things around us.

During the season of Lent, Jesus invites us to go up the mountain with Him. That is being with Jesus in prayer. It is prayer that strengthens our faith, and opens our eyes to see God and have a glimpse of heaven. God is with us now and always.

May this season of Lent be for all of us a time of conversion and renewal, as we prepare for the Holy Week services from 10 - 17 April. Encourage one another as a family to make this a Holy Lent, as we encounter the Crucified and Risen Lord.

If your child will be entering school Year 3 in September, they will have to wait until they have entered school Year 4 in September 2023 before being able to join the First Holy Communion programme.



QR Codes


What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check.

Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money – both of which are very welcome! So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash! *Thank you and God Bless*.
