### 1. Parish 50th anniversary celebration

The celebration will focus around the mass to be held on Saturday, 13th July at 6pm. This is the 15th Sunday of Ordinary Time and Liturgically it is the first Mass of Sunday. The Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Alan and Fr. Stewart Foster, Diocesan Archivist and Historian, will say the homily.

Fr. Stewart has kindly created a commemorative booklet which documents the history of our church with references to significant events from the reformation to the current day, including many photographs and images to ensure this is a thoughtful and engaging celebration of our parish and church. We are arranging for the booklets to be printed in time for our celebration; a donation of  $\pounds 5$  is suggested for each booklet to cover costs.

A cold buffet and drinks will be available after Mass and all parishioners are encouraged to join Bishop Alan, current and prior priests of our parish and other guests to celebrate this historic event.

Finally, all parishioners are asked to bring photos of the church and parish events prior to the celebration to be carefully displayed in the parish hall. Photos from the diocesan archives will be displayed too, to bring our history to life.

### **IN TODAYS GOSPEL**

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place".

These words remind us that Pentecost was not a new festival but one that already existed in the Judaic calendar. In the Old Testament the festival of Pentecost is also known as the Feast of Weeks because in Leviticus 23:15-16 God commanded the Jews to count seven full weeks (or 49 days) beginning on the second day of Passover, and then present offerings of new grain to the Lord as a lasting ordinance. The term "Pentecost" derives from the Greek word meaning "fifty". While initially a festival for expressing thankfulness to the Lord for the blessing of the harvest, the celebration is also tied to the giving of the Ten Commandments since Jews believe that it was precisely at this time that God gave the Torah to the people through Moses on Mount Sinai.

In his description of the descent of the Holy Spirit in Acts 2, Luke deliberately seeks to evoke the theophany of Sinai. Church liturgy confirms this interpretation as it has inserted Exodus 19 among the readings for the Pentecost vigil. What is the significance of the fact that the Holy Spirit descended on the Church precisely on the day Israel recalled the gift of the law and the covenant? The answer is clear. It was to show that he is the new law, the spiritual law, which seals the new and eternal covenant, and it is he who consecrates the royal and priestly people that form the Church. Commenting on this wonderful revelation, St Augustine exclaimed: "Who wouldn't be struck by this coincidence and at the same time by this difference? Fifty days pass between the celebration of the Passover and the day on which Moses received the law written by God's finger on tablets of stone; similarly, fifty days after the death and resurrection of the one who like a lamb was slaughtered, the finger of God, that is the Holy Spirit, filled the faithful who ware gathered together" (On the Spirit and the Letter, 16,28).

The Holy Spirit has written the new law on our hearts by pouring his love into them so that we can love God and our neighbour. It is a new capacity to love, live and be fully human, fully alive. Lord God, we give you thanks and praise for the gift of your wonderful Holy Spirit poured out at Pentecost.
