

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Lift up your heads, O gates! And be lifted up, O ancient doors!

That the King of Glory may come in.

In the processional hymn which celebrates the Ark of the Covenant entering Jerusalem's temple, the Psalmist leads us in joyful prayer and praise. For the Jews, the Ark was the seat of God; it was where the Lord dwelt. The worshippers cry for the gates to open so that the Lord of hosts can enter. We echo this cry on the Feast of Christ the King; we who worship the Father in spirit and truth acknowledge Jesus' rightful place on the throne of glory, at his Father's right hand.

Jesus is the Son, the King, the Lord, the Alpha and the Omega, the One who overcame our deadliest foes: sin, Satan and death. John records the eternal hymn of praise of the four living creatures, capturing the glory, honour, worship and praise which are due to Jesus, the Servant King, because he laid down his life only to take it up again: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty' (Rev. 4:8).

Jesus is truly enthroned as King as we longingly await the full unveiling and realization of the kingdom: '...until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death' (1 Cor. 15:25-26).

We are living in the age of the Church; the end times have been a reality since Jesus ascended into heaven. When he comes again in glory, sin, death and corruption will be overthrown entirely: 'When all things are subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to him [the Father] who put all things under him, that God may be everything to everyone' (1 Cor. 15:28).

The kingship and lordship of Jesus underpin our faith. Today, as the liturgical year draws to a close, we prepare to celebrate once more the coming of the King of Kings who laid aside his majesty and glory to humble himself by being born, not in regal comfort, but in a lowly stable.

Open the gates of your heart. Let the King of glory enter and take up residence there as the Lord and King of your life.



Welcome to our parish family and visitors to our Sunday Mass on this feast our Christ our King. Today's Gospel is from John. It's an extract from the judgement of Jesus before Pilate. In answer to the question 'So you are a King' Jesus responds 'His kingdom is not of this world. Yes I am a King, for this I was born to bear witness to the truth'.

As Catholics our calling in our daily life is to bear witness to the truth. Jesus is the Son of God. He came to redeem us from sin which would lead Him to his passion and death on

the cross and His glorious resurrection. He has taught us through the Scriptures and through prayer about the love of the Father for each one of us. How often do we tell Our Father that we love him? Now is the time for us to step out of ourselves and look outwards to find Jesus in our daily lives. To ask ourselves what are our true values?

As Advent approachs let us put the preparation of our lives towards God's kingdom first and then prepare for the celebration of Christ's birth. We have the Sacraments of the Church left to us by Jesus to help us to navigate our world. I ask you to think seriously about the Sacrament of Reconciliation in order to truly enjoy Christmas and what it means for us. This Sacrament is top of our list. Peter said to Jesus after one of his miracles 'Lord depart from me for I am a sinful man'. The tax collector said to Jesus 'Be merciful to me a sinner'. We need to come to Jesus, to open the door of our hearts to Him and receive His forgiveness and mercy.

The goal of our advent pilgrimage then is to return to our Father's house. May the Lord bless us all this Advent. May his Word be born afresh within us. May we receive an anointing of grace so that his light may shine more brightly within us and in our world today.

Journey Home (Continued)

Offer a contrite heart.

Coming into the presence of God, the All Holy One, should make us more sensitive to the barriers we have placed between ourselves and Him by our sinfulness and lack of faith. Bringing a contrite heart before God, we also recognise how rich He is in mercy and forgiveness, how slow to anger. Practice attentive listening.

If the readings at Mass are to ignite our Hearts and make them burn with love for God then they must not only be proclaimed with conviction but need to be listened to with an attentive ear and open heart. (to be continued)

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament


