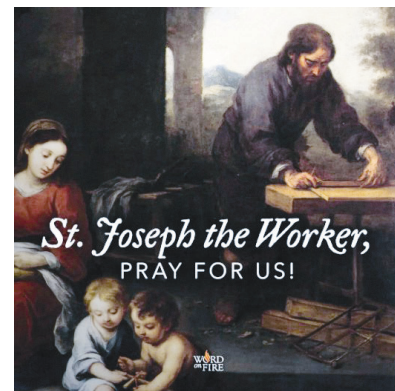

## IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Jesus' teaching on prayer is radical and challenging. Radical because he urges us to pray "God as our Father"; challenging because he encourages us to be bold and persistent. Our desire for prayer is often determined by external rather than internal pressures. When we are in trouble or our need is acute we suddenly discover the gift of prayer. A classic response these days is. "I'm not a religious person but I've never prayed so hard in all my life". Exams, work difficulties, a job interview or a domestic crisis move us unashamedly to prayer.

We tend to turn to prayer as a last resort rather than our first stop. We also give up easily, don't persevere and can lose confidence quickly. This response is human and natural, but Jesus wants to teach us a more godly way. His teaching on prayer is geared towards expanding our horizons and opening us up to a new world of hope, expectancy and confidence. Use today's Gospel as an opportunity to have your thinking challenged. After all, we're privileged to have the teaching of the Master; no teacher on prayer can compete with the wisdom of Jesus.

Do you know God is your Father? Many struggle with this glorious truth. Perhaps their own experience of fatherhood was not good, which tends to cloud their understanding. The truth that Jesus wanted us to grasp and hold on to is that God is our Father and loves each and every one of us as if we were his only child. God longs for us to pray to him in a close, warm and intimate way. He wants us to have a fruitful prayer life; to hope for that which seems beyond hope, to intercede for situations or people which seem beyond redemption or help. We're all in the school of Christ and this module is the most difficult. Its rewards are eternal and lasting and its effects wonderful, but we need a courageous heart to be faithful and persevere.

Welcome to our celebration this weekend to our parish family and our visitors.

This weekend is World Day for the Grandparents and the Elderly. Pope Francis quotes from psalm 92:15 "in old age they will still bear fruit". These words of the Psalmist are glad tidings, a true "gospel" that we proclaim to all on this day of World Day for grandparents and the elderly. Many people are afraid of the elderly. They consider it as a disease with which any contact is best avoided. A long life - so the

Bible teaches - is a blessing and the elderly are not outcasts to be shunned but living signs of the goodness of God who bestows life in abundance. Blessed is the house where an older person lives! Blessed is the family that honours the elderly. Pope Francis says "Dear grandparents, Dear elderly, we are called to be artisans of the revolution of tenderness in our world. Our trustful prayer can do a great deal: it can accompany the cry of pain of those who suffer, and it can change hearts. We can be the enduring chorus of a great spiritual sanctuary, where prayers of supplication and songs of praise sustain the community that toils and struggles in the fields of life". Our Holy Father continues "This world day of grandparents and the elderly is an opportunity to proclaim with joy, that the church wants to celebrate with all those whom the Lord - in the words of the Bible - has filled with joy. Let us ask Our Lady, Mother of Tender Love to make all of us artisans of the revolution of tenderness, so that together we can set the world free from the spectre of loneliness and the demon of war. The Pope concludes from a very long speech "To all of you and your loved ones, I send my blessing and the assurance of my closeness and affection". And He concludes not to forget to pray for Him.

## Mass For Grandparents

Today is the Second World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly and Mass will be celebrated throughout the universal Church. The theme chosen by the Holy Father for the occasion is "In old age they will still bear fruit" (Psalm 92:15) and intends to emphasize how grandparents and the elderly are a value and a gift both for society and for ecclesial communities.

The theme is also an invitation to reconsider and value grandparents and the elderly who are too often kept on the margins of families, civil and ecclesial communities. Their experience of life and faith can contribute, in fact, to building societies that are aware of their roots and capable of dreaming of a future based on greater solidarity.

The invitation to listen to the wisdom of the years is also particularly significant in the context of the synodal journey that the Church has undertaken.

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## March For Life: 3 September

This year marks the sad milestone of 10 million abortions in the UK since the 1967 Abortion Act. It is more important than ever that all people of goodwill, and especially Catholics, give public witness to the infinite dignity of human life. We can do so at the annual March for Life held on Saturday 3 September. Bishop Sherrington will celebrate Mass at 11.00 a.m. at St. George's Cathedral, Southwark. Priests are welcome to concelebrate. LifeFest22 is a pro-life, family-friendly festival held 10.30 a.m. - 1.30 p.m. at the Emmanuel Centre, Marsham Street SW1P 3DW. The March itself starts at the Emmanuel Centre at 2.00 p.m., proceeding to Parliament Square, where there will be testimony and speeches, with the day concluding at 4.30 p.m. More information can be found at <https://www.marchforlife.co.uk/> Our witness is vital. ### Visiting the lonely elderly

The second World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly will be celebrated in a situation in which in many countries the health emergency has ended, which will allow initiatives to be taken with greater freedom and to put personal encounter and embrace at the centre of each one. In order for the message of closeness and consolation that the Day wants to express to reach everyone – even those who are most isolated – we ask people to make a visit to their grandparents and the lonely elderly in their community and to deliver the Holy Father's message to them.

The visit, a tangible sign of the outgoing Church, is a way to reaffirm that the elderly, even the loneliest, are at the centre of our communities.

The visit shows the personal choice to get up and go quickly to others (cf. Lk. 1:39), just as Mary did to visit the elderly Elizabeth.

The visit can be an opportunity to bring a gift, such as a flower, and to read the Day's prayer together.

Visiting a lonely elderly person is one of the possibilities for obtaining the Plenary Indulgence granted on the occasion of the Day. The encounter between young and old, the friendship that can result, is one of the signs that "In old age they will still bear fruit."

## Journey Home – Threshold Of Hope

Our Catholic Faith from Catechism of the Catholic Church

### THE THIRD COMMANDMENT

Scripture also reveals on the Lord's day was the liberation of Israel from the damage of Egypt. "The Lord your God recommended you to keep the Sabbath day." The gospel reports of the many incidents was accused of violating the Sabbath law. But Jesus never fails to respect the holiness of this day. Jesus rose from the dead "on the first day of the week" Because it was the "first day" the day of Christ's resurrection recalls the first creation. Because it is the eighth day following the Sabbath. It symbolises the new creation ushered in by Christ's Resurrection.

Sunday is expressly distinguished from the Sabbath which it chronologically every week, for Christmas its ceremonial observance replaces that of the Sabbath. In cherish Passover, Sunday fulfils the spiritual truth of the Jewish Sabbath in God. For worship under the law prepared for the mystery of Christ, and what was done there prefigured some aspects of Christ... The practice of the Christian assembly dates from the beginning of the apostolic age. "The letter to the Hebrews reminds the faithful" not to neglect to meet together as is the habit of some, but to encourage one another.... The precepts of the church specifies the law of the Lord more precisely "on Sunday and another holy day of obligation the faithful are bound to participate in the mass." The precept of participating in the mass is satisfied at a mass which is celebrated anyway in a Catholics rite, either on the holy day or on the evening of the preceding day.

The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and conformation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason - for example illness, care of an infant or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin. (2181 Catechism of the Catholic Faith).
