IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Do you know Luther Vandross' song. 'What The World Needs Now is Love? If you're familiar with it you might be tempted to sing or hum it - it's quite catchy, after all! The key lyric is: 'What the world needs now, is love, sweet love. It's the only thing that there's just too little of.' But what kind of love does the world need?

We invite you to ponder, reflect on and put into practice the vision of love uppacked by Pope Paul VI: 'Above all the gospel must be proclaimed by witness. Take a Christian or a handful of Christians who, in the midst of their own community, show their capacity for understanding and acceptance, their sharing of life and destiny with other people, their solidarity with the efforts of all for whatever is noble and good.' 'Let us suppose that...they radiate in an altogether simple and unaffected way their faith in values that go beyond current values, and their hope in something that is not seen and that one would not dare to imagine.'

Through this wordless witness these Christians stir up irresistible questions in the hearts of those who see how they live: Why are they like this? Why do they live in this way? What or who is it that inspires them? Why are they in our midst?

'Such a witness is...a silent proclamation of the Good News and a very powerful and effective one. Here we have an initial act of evangelization. The above questions will ask whether they are people to whom Christ has never been proclaimed, or baptized people who do not practise, or people who live as nominal Christians but according to principles that are in no way Christian, or people who are seeking...something or someone whom they sense but cannot name.'

'Other questions will arise, deeper and more demanding ones...evoked by this witness which involves presence, sharing, solidarity, and which is an essential element, and generally the first one, in evangelization.' (Evangelii Nuntiandi 21) Lord, you gave us a new command to love, but in truth it is an ancient command, rooted in revelation. What is new, O Lord, is that we love as you first loved us.

Catholic Faith (Continued)

CONFIRMATION: In this sacrament we receive the gift of the Hoy Spirit, Wisdom, Knowledge, right judgement, understanding, courage, piety and fear of the Lord. In this way, the sacrament of confirmation completes the sacrament of Baptism. Baptism, the Eucharist and confirmation together complete the sacraments of Christian initiation, whose unity must be safeguarded. It must be explained to the faithful that the reception or sacrament of confirmation is necessary for the completion of Baptismal grace. For by the sacrament of confirmation, (the Baptised) are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed. (Catechism of Catholic Church, 1285). Please pray in church and at home for those preparing for this sacrament of confirmation in October.

Giftaid-it

What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check.

Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money - both of which are very welcome! So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash!
