

# IN THE GOSPEL TODAY

During Lent we're led by the Spirit into the mystery of Jesus' sojourn in the desert: 'By the solemn forty days of Lent the Church unites herself...to the mystery of Jesus in the desert' (CCC 540). Isn't it amazing to ponder that in a mystical way, through our own struggles and temptations, we have some share in Jesus' testing in the desert? The story of Jesus' temptations appears in all three synoptic Gospels (Matthew. Mark and Luke), but not John. Each of the Evangelists is clear that Jesus was tempted by Satan. The name Satan means 'adversary'. In the Book of Job we're given a vivid picture of Satan in God's heavenly court, where he has the role of accuser or prosecutor (see 1:6-12). The Scriptures identify Satan as the serpent in the Garden of Eden who tempted Adam and Eve (Gen. 3) and, therefore, as the origin of sin and temptation.

What the Scriptures and tradition make clear is that humankind has a mortal enemy who. although a finite being created by God, is in a desperate struggle to overthrow God's reign, usurp his Lordship and lead his creation into darkness and death. How interesting that when we renew our baptismal vows over Easter, we're invited to reject Satan and all his empty promises.

We're constantly tempted in many and varied ways. But temptation isn't a sin; it doesn't become one until we succumb. Jesus didn't succumb and because he was tempted, he can identify with the suffering we endure when we're tempted. Perhaps our religious formation put the accent on resisting sexual sin and temptation is often perceived in these terms. However, we're tempted in many and varied ways: to gossip, spite, arrogance, resentment and anger, and so on.

Lent, then, is a time of spiritual combat; and every soldier knows the dictum: know thy enemy. The devil is finite, merely a creature who can be defeated. Our struggle, then, isn't against flesh and blood but against the devil and his spiritual forces.

Lord, armed with truth, righteousness, and readiness to proclaim the Gospel, I say with confidence, 'Get behind me, Satan!' (Matt. 16:23)


We should have regular mass for our loved ones (Holy Souls) as often as we can.

Welcome to all our parishioners and visitors.

Today we begin a very important season leading us to the joys of Easter. Pope Benedict XVI said "Looking closely at this little piece of white Host, this bread of the poor, appears to us as a synthesis of creation...... In this way we begin to understand why the Lord chooses this piece of bread to represent him. Creation with all of its gifts, aspires above and beyond itself to something even greater'

The Lord mentioned its deepest mystery on Palm Sunday, when some Greeks asked to see him. In his answer to this question is the phrase: "Truly truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit"

The mystery of the passion is hidden in the bread made of ground grain. Flour, the ground wheat, presupposes the death and resurrection of the grain. In being ground and baked, it carries in itself once again the same mystery of the Passion. Only through death does resurrection arrive, as does the fruit and new life. "Every day we walk the way of the cross".

May this season of Lent be a time of repentance and conversion as we prepare for this solemn occasion leading us to the joy of Easter. Remember every Friday is a day of abstinence. However, the first Friday of Lent is a Fast Day. Please see the rest of the newsletter for suggestions of how we can spiritually prepare for Easter. # Journey Home Threshold of Hope (Continued)

IN BRIEF: THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST

The signs of bread and wine.

In the Old Covenant bread and wine were offered in sacrifice among the first fruits of the earth as a sign of grateful

acknowledgment to the Creator. But they also received a new significance in the context of the Exodus: the unleavened bread that Israel eats every year at Passover commemorates the haste of the departure that liberated them from Egypt; the remembrance of the manna in the desert will always recall to Israel that it lives by the bread of the of the Word of God; their daily bread is the fruit of the promised land, the pledge of God's faithfulness to his promises. The "cup of blessing" at the end of the Jewish Passover meal adds to the festive joy of wine an eschatological dimension: the messianic expectation of the rebuilding of Jerusalem. When Jesus instituted the Eucharist, he gave a new and definitive meaning to the blessing of the bread and the

# **Ukrainian Emergency Winter Appeal**

Ukrainians remain resilient despite the circumstances of the war, but they are in the throes of a harsh winter. For that reason, a new Emergency Winter Appeal was launched to provide food packages for the most vulnerable on the frontlines and in recently liberated regions in East and South Ukraine which is suffering from a severe humanitarian crisis.

The cost of one food parcel, providing enough food for two people for a week costs approximately £16. Each package contains the basics (grains, flour, pasta, meat and fish preserves, oil, canned vegetables, sugar, tea coffee, biscuits, etc.).

It is hoped that £160,000 can be raised allow the supply of 10,000 food parcels to those most in need and I ask that you and your parishioners will consider supporting this Emergency Winter Appeal.


