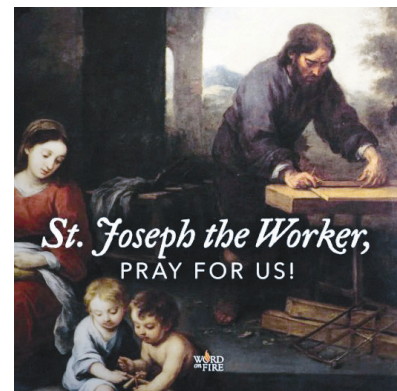

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit totally transformed the apostles, changing everything. Once cowardly, confused and lacking in confidence, they became convinced, certain and clear after receiving the Holy Spirit. The old creation gave way to the new.

Do you long for a greater glimpse of Jesus' glory? Do you thirst for a greater outpouring of the Spirit for yourself, the Church and the world? If the answer to these questions is a resounding 'Yes', be assured that this is the work of the Spirit. Just as a lover delights in showering gifts upon their beloved, so too God blesses and anoints his people with his Spirit.

The Spirit is given so we can live out our vocation, so we can live a life in the Spirit. At the dawn of creation, God breathed his life into creation and at the birth of the new creation the Lord breathed his life into his disciples, saying, 'Receive the Holy Spirit' (John 20:22). Our capacity to receive the Spirit is determined by our attitude. The Spirit retreats from self-reliance, self-confidence and self-assurance, but is quick to comfort the broken-hearted, the poor in spirit, the needy and the humble. The disciples were filled with the Spirit because they were empty in themselves.

The gift of the Spirit at Pentecost is a recurring event in the life of the Church. Today we can receive and enjoy the Spirit in a new and exciting way. Don't be afraid to cry out, 'Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful.' What can prevent us from being filled with the Spirit is that we rely too heavily on our own ability, not necessarily realizing that even this is given to us by God.

Our confidence in ourselves is often greater than our confidence in God! We need to be humbled by our own limitations and overwhelmed by our own weaknesses so that we can pray with heartfelt conviction:

"Renew your wonders in this our day, as by a new Pentecost. Grant to your Church that, being of one mind and steadfast in prayer with Mary....and following the lead of blessed Peter, it may advance the reign of our Divine Saviour, the reign of truth...justice...love and peace". (Pope St John XXIII)

Baptism and Confirmation. Today then we celebrate the entry of the Spirit and begin what we know as Church history. The Apostles begin converting and the church grows through the influence of the Spirit. That is why we think of Pentecost as our birthday as a church. For each one of us, we have been through 50 days of celebration of the risen Christ - and now we begin to make Christ known to all we meet, in our families, in our community and the friends and people that we meet in our everyday lives with the help and influence of the Holy Spirit.

All our prayers should begin by invocation of the Holy Spirit such as "Come Holy Spirit, fill my heart with your love and kindle in me the fire of your love". In difficult situations, in living faithfully our Catholic faith, to help us to understand what we believe, ask for the help of the Holy Spirit and let the Holy Spirit teach you what needs to be done to be a good Christian. Let the Spirit inform your conscience to help you make decisions. Don't let the Spirit be the forgotten person of God.

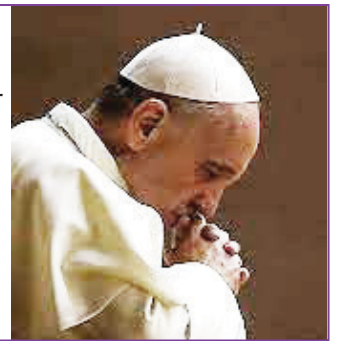

Our Catholic Faith - Continued

Confession is the sacrament in which we receive forgiveness from Jesus Christ. We repent and confess our sins, and are absolved of sin through the ministry of priest, who acts in the person of Christ. "On the evening of that day, the first day of the week" Jesus showed himself to the apostles. "He breathed on them, and said to them: Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven. If you retain the sins of any, they are retained". (Jn 20:19,22-23).

Confession is important because it is the normal way we can be forgiven for serious sins committed after Baptism. Sin damages our relationship with God and with the church. It is this sacrament that reconciles us once again with God. Regular confession is important because it helps us to come close to Christ and developed a mature conscience. The act of confessing itself bestows healing and a sense of release from the burden of sin. If we have missed Mass on Sunday or Holy Days of Obligation or have committed a serious sin, it is important to go to confession before receiving Holy Communion. In confession, the penitent is asked to confess their sins, express contrition and by penance seek to amend their lives. It is a journey of beauty through which we seek to die to the old self and be born again in Christ who is beauty, bestowed upon us in Baptism.

If you have not received the sacrament of confession for several years, do not be afraid. The priest is there to help you. When you go to confession simply tell the priest that it has been a long time and ask him for guidance.

You can receive this sacrament in any Catholic Church as well as St Joseph's.

To make a donation please scan the QR code for the appropriate amount. If you wish to Giftaid-it please scan the codes in the Giftaid-it section after reading the declaration.

QR Codes

What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check.

Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money – both of which are very welcome! So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash! *Thank you and God Bless.*
