HAPPY FATHER'S DAY TO YOU AND YOUR FAMILIES



Hello and welcome to all our parish family to our Sunday Holy Mass.

In today's Gospel, Jesus invited his disciples to cross to the other side. We hear a storm blow up and Jesus was asleep. They woke him up and said "Teacher, we are going down". Jesus calmed the sea and then turned to the disciples and said "Have you no faith?"

It must have been a huge storm because the disciples were fishermen and would be used to storms. We all face fears in our lives. Jesus never promised a life without storms. We all have to deal with difficult situations but Jesus promised us that He would be with us. When we face fears, we need to have faith, and pray about it. A simple prayer of St. Faustina was "Jesus, I trust in You".

We are all very human and life is uncertain for all of us. The pandemic we are going through is a huge example but there are many more. We need to have a strong faith in Jesus. Where does prayer fit into our lives? When do we reflect on the Word of God? Where does our Sunday Mass

fit into our lives and when we are at Mass, despite distractions, are we praying the Mass with Our Lord? The temptation is that we are all busy with our lives and our problems and we forget to keep the Sunday Holy. We forget Jesus. There are two basic truths that the gospel reveals. First that God is with you in the boat of life and is aware of what you are battling about. You cannot be with him and sink. Second, in the boat of life which you are navigating, you cannot overcome the storms of life alone. Hence Jesus says "Apart from me, you can do nothing". There is no doubt that before inviting Christ, his disciples tried to cope on their own. However they failed and cried out "Lord do you not care if we perish"? In Psalm 50 Jesus assures us "call upon me in times of distress and trouble and I will help you". We welcome again our parish family back to our parish community. I wish God's blessing on you all and keep Mary close to you always.

COVID RESTRICTIONS

From 26 June Holy Communion will be distributed after the Priests Communion (as we used to do), and NOT at the end of Mass. The Eucharistic minister can say The Body of Christ to which you reply Amen (as we used to do).
