

Journey Home Threshold of Hope (Continued)

Today's Gospel reveals a wonderful truth about God, expressed in a way that no mere human mind could express, which emphasizes that these words of Jesus come straight from God's own heart. It's as if he's speaking to them directly into our own hearts. We can divide these five verses into three categories: the Father's delight, the relationship between the Father and the Son, and the grace of revelation. Jesus teaches us that God the Father delights in pouring out a gift of revelation upon his children. 'Revelation' in this context is all about us having the grace to enter more deeply into the mystery of God. In the Christian faith there are no new truths, simply the ancient revelation of Scripture, the Creed and the teaching of the Church, and it's in these truths that we immerse our minds and hearts. As we do so, the Holy Spirit opens up our minds and hearts to see hidden depths, new meaning and fresh interpretations, all of which touch us deeply and move us to love and worship God. This is a birthright which we all received at our baptism, and we're therefore a people who receive light and revelation from God.
