IN THE GOSPEL TODAY

Similarly to yesterday, bear in mind as you read or hear Matthew's account of Jesus' Passion that his brutal death wasn't the result of chance, coincidence or circumstance, but part of the mystery of God's plan. Every detail, movement and nuance, every word, action and event were carried out precisely according to God's definite plan and foreknowledge. Again, as we saw yesterday, this doesn't mean that all the key players were merely passive, but be conscious and aware of the heartbeat of God's purpose and Jesus' authority to freely lay down his life and to freely take it up again.

All four Evangelists highlight the crucifixion as the reason why the Son of God became man. He was destined to suffer, die and raise us up with him. Underpinning all of this is God's love for us all. Jesus' heart was full of the Father's love for each one of us. He spent himself out of love for us, and the cross became the source of our eternal salvation. Jesus' death on the cross justifies every human being who believes in him; it makes us righteous, holy and pleasing to God. God wants us to believe, follow and worship his Son, Jesus, acknowledging him as our Saviour. This is why our prayer as we enter into Holy Week must be: 'Hail, O Cross, our only hope.' Jesus' death is the most important death in human history because it alone saved the human race. It was a unique sacrifice, and Jesus is the one and only mediator between God and humankind. As God Incarnate, he has united himself to us all and gives us the opportunity to be sharers in his Paschal Mystery.

We're all called to take up our cross and follow Christ, for just as he suffered, so too must we. Our vocation is to follow in his steps. Our hope and prayer are that, in this most holy and special of weeks, each of us can grow in our love, devotion and worship of Jesus on the cross: the Crucified One who is the Saviour of the world.

'Apart from the cross, there is no other ladder by which we may get to heaven.' (St. Rose of Lima)
