synagogue service, but the living, breathing and active word of God. His message was very simple: on that day, before their very eyes, God's word was fulfilled. The Spirit of the Lord was truly upon him, he was and is the Lord's anointed, and his mission was to proclaim freedom for the prisoner, sight for the blind, release for the oppressed and the arrival oi the year of the Lord's favour.

All was going so well until someone in the crowd, no doubt echoing what many were thinking, asked: "Is not this Joseph's son?" Jesus must have realized the passive aggression and cynicism behind the question because he referenced the widow at Zarephath and the leper Naaman, the Syrian, clearly indicating for whom he had come - the widows, the lepers, the outsiders. Jesus' whole ministry would be for the least of these. It was these words of inclusion, Jesus' own interpretation of his ministry, that elicited a very quick transition from awe to rage, from acceptance to rejection, from receptivity to outright murder in the hearts of those who heard his words.

Remembering the role of the Old Testament prophets is important because prophecy is not merely about predicting the future but discerning God's will, challenging the status quo, pointing to what God is doing right here and right now. The cliffhanger in today's reading is that the crowd almost threw Jesus off a cliff, but his time had not come, and Luke records that he walked right through them and went on his way.

Through the grace of our baptism we are called to be prophets - we have received the grace of priest, prophet and king - and this prophetic ministry invites us to listen to what the Spirit is saying today.

Lord, may your spirit come upon me: may I preach the good news to the poor, proclaim freedom to captives, recovery of sight for the blind and announce that every day is a day of God's mercy, love and favour.

Welcome to our parishioners and visitors to our Sunday celebration.

It is important that we are seated in the church before Mass begins as well as remaining quiet. We should be preparing ourselves for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery. We do this by our Penitential Rite before we listen to the word of God. Pope Benedict XVI says "Every child who is born brings us God's smile and invites us to recognise that life is his gift, a gift to be welcomed with love and preserved with care

a gift to be welcomed with love and preserved with care, always and every moment. God entrusts every child who is born to his parents: so how important is the family founded on marriage, the cradle of life and love. The house of Nazareth where the Holy Family lived is the model of simplicity, patience and harmony for all Christian families. I pray the Lord that your family too may be welcoming places where these little ones grow in good health and also in faith and love of God".

Today's Gospel passage is a clear reminder that when God's messengers speak the truth in love, they risk rejection and opposition. Jesus in the synagogue faces such rejection and not because he is a local young man of Nazareth, but because his biblical message about God's universe, love and salvation contains a truth that the audience cannot deny, and that angers the religious and political leaders. He is immediately considered dangerous and subversive. The readings remind us that our call to discipleship, like that of Jeremiah and Jesus, must be rooted in love. Secondly, the reading also assures us that God never abandons his faithful messengers when they speak the truth in love. Thirdly, just like Jeremiah, Jesus and Paul, we too are challenged to live our calling as Christians even if, in doing so, we may risk our comfort, rejection, and even our lives.
