IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Sex grabs our attention. It also sells most things: magazines, newspapers, cars, boats, jewellery, bras - you name it; sexual imagery is used to promote it and persuade us to buy it. And it's not just aimed at men, but women just as much. We're sexual beings and sexuality, let's be honest, plays an integral part in our lives. There is, however, a notion that Christians are easily scandalized and shocked by all things sexual, and indignant towards those who fall from grace in this area.

The idea of the religious prude is firmly stuck in literature and culture. Interestingly, the early manuscripts of John's Gospel don't carry today's incident of the woman caught in adultery. It's missing from our oldest and most reliable Greek manuscripts and seems to have been unknown to the early Greek Fathers, since they didn't comment on it. The earliest specific reference to it is found in a third-century writing on Church discipline called the Didascalia. Why this happened we cannot be sure. Some scholars believe that it reads incredibly like a Lucan narrative, dealing as it does with sin and mercy - and with a woman! Others suggest that Jesus' response was so shocking, the forgiveness so radical, his compassion and mercy so scandalous, that it was thought best to remove it from the canon altogether.

Interestingly, St. Jerome tried to have the Song of Songs removed from Scripture because of the danger of an erotic interpretation of what is in essence a love song and an allegory for Christ's love for his bride, the Church. Thankfully, common sense and grace (often the same thing) prevailed for both these events, and we revere them as sacred Scripture, divinely inspired and given to teach us the way of salvation. In his encounter with the woman caught in adultery Jesus is full of compassion, kindness and mercy but also firm and clear that she must strive with all her heart and soul not to sin in this way again.

"Lord, grant me a compassionate heart towards those who sin or fall sexually, but also create in me a pure heart which seeks to uphold the dignity of all around me, and leads me away from sexual temptation".

Welcome to all our parish family and those who are visiting us for the first time. It is lovely to see you all.

Our Mass attendance is around 100 people over two Masses. This is considerably down since before the pandemic. I know we do not have an 8.30 a.m. Sunday morning Mass anymore, and that is mainly due to the fact that we do not have the numbers to warrant three Masses. Those of us who used to go to the 8.30 a.m. Mass please do come to one of our other two Masses. You are sadly missed and our parish of St. Joseph is all the poorer by your absence. It causes me and our parishioners

a lot of sadness. So I do ask you who go elsewhere, to come home to us or if you don't come to Mass Our Blessed Lord invites you to return to Him during the season of Lent. We need to remember our past parishioners who prayed every day, sixty odd years ago, that permission would be granted to build a church here after many rejections. Their prayers and sacrifices were granted and our church became a great witness to our presence of St. Joseph's which was crowded every Sunday and became an important visible sign of God's presence in Hutton. We have available the great history of our parish. Copies are available free of charge for those who wish one. Let us again pray that our people will return to the practice of their faith and a deep personal love for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Our gospel today reflects on the woman who had been caught in adultery: and making her stand before all after quoting the law and demanding her to be stoned. However, Jesus did not go according to their law but did something new both in her life and in the life of the accusers. His mission is only to seek out and to save those who are lost and not to condemn anyone. Our God does not desire the death of anyone, but rather he brings us life and love in abundance. We are constantly called to repentance and conversion, for God wants life for us and not death. God is rich in mercy, slow to anger and ready to relent.(Jonah 4,2)

Let us not be quick in passing judgements, in condemning others and claiming selfrighteousness. 'For if the Lord should mark our guilt, who would survive' (ps 130.3). Jesus said to the woman 'where are your accusers'? Has no one condemned you'?. No one Lord. Jesus said neither do I condemn you, go and sin no more.

May this new grace of God help us in living our good Christian life, bringing about newness of everything that is good. Please pray for me.

Threshold of Hope -Preparation before Mass.

A personal encounter with the crucified and risen Lord, in the celebration of the Mass is not simply a private affair. This meeting always takes place as part of the action of the whole church including the angels, the martyrs and all the Saints. To take our place amongst this great company and to receive the grace of Holy Communion, should involve some preparation, in order that we can abandon ourselves more completely to the saving mysteries that we celebrate. To that end I would appreciate if we could come to our sacred celebration with a deep sense of reverence. I ask in particular that all ministers of word and sacrament not to wear shorts even if you're not ministering (in case you are asked). Remember "This is the bread which comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread which came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever, and the bread that I will give for the life of the Lord is my flesh (John 6:50-51)". Every truth, every hope, healing and consolation are to be found in these words of Christ. They are why, for over 2000 years, Catholics have faithfully obeyed Christ's command at the Last Supper, "Do this in memory of me."

Every Sunday during Lent we have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament between 4.00 p.m. and 5.00 p.m. Come and relax in the presence of Jesus with your children and young people for as long as you wish.

Also on Fridays we have the devotion of the Stations of the Cross at 7.00 p.m. There are Stations of the Cross booklets on sale at the back of the church should you wish to say them at home.

Also Confessions on Saturdays between 10.00 a.m. and 10.30 a.m., or by request before Mass. May this season of Lent be for all of us a time of conversion and renewal, as we prepare for the Holy Week services from 10 - 17 April. Encourage one another as a family to make this a Holy Lent, as we encounter the Crucified and Risen Lord.

First Holy Communion

For those children who are currently in school Year 3, we will be beginning a new First Holy Communion course in the autumn, and we will be announcing more information about this shortly. Please note that the course in the autumn will only be for children who will be in school Year 4 or above from September 2022. If your child will be entering school Year 3 in September, they will have to wait until they have entered school Year 4 in September 2023 before being able to join the First Holy Communion programme.


QR Codes

What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check.
