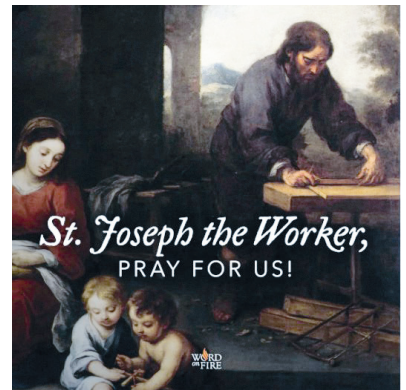

## IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Two significant themes in the Bible are light/darkness and being blind/able to see. Baptism has always been understood as a journey from the darkness of sin into the light of grace. We all need moments of revelation, in which we who once were blind now come to see. However, there are none so blind as those who cannot see, wonderfully illustrated by the following story.

One bleak winter's day, a man stood on a soapbox at Speakers' Corner in Hyde Park, London, intent on pouring scorn on Christianity and not hiding his contempt: 'People tell me that God exists, but I can't see him. People tell me that there is life after death, but I can't see it. People tell me that there is a judgement to come, but I can't see it. People tell me that there is a heaven and a hell, but I can't see them'. He descended the soapbox to cheap applause.

Another man approached the soapbox, but needed help getting up onto it. He was nervous and unused to this kind of platform but was intent on speaking nevertheless. He began: 'People tell me that there is green grass all around, but I can't see it. People tell me that there is blue sky above, but I can't see it. People tell me that there are trees nearby; but I can't see them. You see, I am blind'.

Bartimaeus was blind, but even in the darkness of blindness he had the light of faith, and was the only person in Mark's Gospel to call Jesus 'Master'. The only other occurrence in the whole of the New Testament was when Mary Magdalene encountered the Risen Lord near the empty tomb (see John 20:16).

So Bartimaeus was not so blind after all! We all have shadows and blind spots in our lives, which we need the light of Christ to illuminate. We have no reason to fear the darkness, for - like Bartimaeus - we just need to turn to the Lord and request the gift of sight.

*Lord Jesus, you shine your light into the dark shadows of my life. I invite you to illuminate the darkness in my life so that I may walk as a child of the light.*

Welcome to all our parishioners to our Sunday Liturgy.

It is only four weeks to the beginning of the Advent season in preparation for the feast of The Birth of Jesus. Now is the time to prepare for this great feast. First by making time for prayer. Your children have been given a small advent booklet provided by your parish. Please take time to look at it and discuss it with your children. Their focus and yours must be primarily on the Birth of Jesus, the moment when God revealed himself as man and began his journey of life which would end on His death on a cross, and

resurrection for the salvation of each one of us. Secondly, reflect on the gospel of Luke especially the Annunciation when the archangel appeared to Mary and told her that she would give birth to a Son. Thirdly, avail yourself in the Sacrament of Confession. This is an important encounter with Jesus and a great example for your children and young people. These and other ways where you can spiritually prepare for Christmas.

Our First Holy Communion children will make their first confession on Friday 3 December. Before then you will be talking to your children about this Sacrament with their book to help you. There are plenty of Christmas items in our repository.

In today's gospel blind man Bartimaeus tells Jesus what he needs with courage and trust in Him. This week we might ask: What needs restoring in my life? Where do I need to take courage and respond to God's call as Bartimaeus did? Let us pray for ourselves and for one another, asking the Lord to help us hear his call clearly as we go about our daily lives.

May he give us the courage to respond joyfully and to encourage those around us. Please remember all those who are sick, the housebound and all who are still suffering from the lockdown and are afraid to go out. May God bless each and everyone of you at all times.

Almighty God increase our faith hope and charity, and make us love you with all our hearts so that we may merit what you promise.

## Journey of Faith Continued

How better can we prepare for Mass?

Firstly, by Prayer. When we pray, God does not change but we do; God does not come down to our level, but we are raised into His divine life by the power of the Holy Spirit. Prayer helps our love for Christ to mature and it strengthens our desire to do the will of our Heavenly Father. Our individual prayer prepares us for Eucharistic prayer at Mass, the high point of all prayer.

We might consider reflecting prayerfully throughout the week on the Mass readings (Bible Alive) for the following Sunday and by doing so become attentive to God speaking to us through his living words. This is sometimes called lectus divine or sacred reading,

Guided by the Holy Spirit, sacred reading focuses on our interior nourishment, if you like, the spiritual marrow that sacred scripture uniquely provides. By savouring the sweetness of God's word, this form of meditative reading enables our hearts to burn with renewed love for God.

To make a donation please scan the QR code for the appropriate amount. If you wish to Giftaid-it please scan the codes in the Giftaid-it section after reading the declaration.

## QR Codes

### What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check. Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money – both of which are very welcome!

So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash! **Thank you and God Bless.**
