November, The Month Of Holy Souls

As we come to the end of the month of the Holy Rosary in October, we now come to the month of November, the month of the Holy Souls. November began last Friday with the upbeat celebration of All Saints. On Saturday 2 November we commemorated the Holy Souls. November has a certain melancholy as we remember our dead. During this month, if we can, we should make a pilgrimage to the place of burial and pray for all who have been buried there. The Church encourages us to gain a Plenary Indulgence for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. To obtain the Plenary Indulgence available in November, we must receive Holy Communion and Sacrament of Confession (and have no attachment to sin). Holy Communion should be received each day to gain the Indulgence for a week. We only need to go to Confession once during this period.

A good prayer to say is "Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them". We must also say one Our Father and one Hail Mary for the intention of our Holy Father. The Bible tells us "it is a wholly and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from their sins".

Prayer for the souls in Purgatory is an expression of our Christian charity, and helps us to remember our own mortality.

November Dead envelopes are at the back of the church. Please place a note with the names of those you wish to pray for mass in the envelope, together with your donation.

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

There is no doubt that as a chief tax collector Zacchaeus would have been hated and despised by his fellow countrymen in the affluent region of Jericho. Basically he had grown rich on the backs of others and was, in effect, a spy, a traitor, a collaborator, low-life scum – in bed, so to speak, with the occupying Roman army.

The truth is every generation has their pariahs. Consider, if you will, how you would react if your bishop was reported to have dined with a local drug baron or was reaching out to ex-prisoners, especially those convicted of sexual crimes (despite this being an essential part of every bishop's ministry). We are easily scandalized! We might find ourselves grumbling, rather as they did in Jesus' day, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner".

This encounter between Jesus of Nazareth and Zacchaeus highlights perfectly the "scandal of grace". It brings to the fore this very important biblical teaching that where sin abounds, grace super-abounds. It shows us that sin, darkness and moral confusion attract rather than repel God – because God loves the sinner but hates the sin.

Now that doesn't mean therefore, in the case of child abusers, for example, that mercy trumps judgement because justice is an integral part of mercy. The institutional cover-up of child abusers by Church leaders, moving them from diocese to diocese, had nothing to do with mercy and everything to do with moral cowardice and the delusion that, by protecting a criminal from the law, they were in some way protecting the reputation of the Church, when in fact they were destroying the reputation of the Church.

Zacchaeus' behaviour, although morally dubious, was not criminal. Through his encounter with Jesus he had an experience of God's mercy and compassion which touched and healed him, and led him to repentance and conversion. No one is beyond God's grace and mercy. We are to be a living expression, a sign, a sacrament, of this same mercy, kindness and forgiveness. Learning to forgive others, to hold out the hand of friendship and brotherhood/sisterhood to those we find difficult, isn't easy: in fact, without God's grace it's impossible, but with God's grace all things are possible.

Lord, you treated everyone you met with great dignity and compassion; as persons created in your image and likeness. May I now go and do likewise.

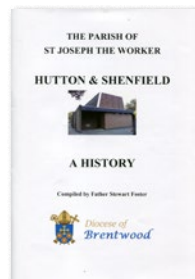
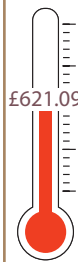
