

Journey Home Threshold of Hope (Continued)

By the same charity that it enkindles in us, the Eucharist preserves us from future mortal sins. The more we share the life of Christ and progress in his friendship, the more difficult it is to break away from him by mortal sin. The Eucharist is not ordered to the forgiveness of mortal sins - that is proper to the sacrament of Reconciliation. The Eucharist is properly the sacrament of those who are in full communion with the Church.

Familial relationships are the deepest human relationships. The love we have for our parents, children and spouses is sacrosanct and profound. Everyone understands this, and this is why Jesus' teaching today can make us uncomfortable and uneasy: 'Anyone who loves their father or mother.... Son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me'. Indeed, honouring our parents is so cherished and revered that it is the fourth of the Ten Commandments. Jesus came to fulfil the law not abolish it, so what can this mean? We need to dig more deeply and ask the Holy Spirit to enlighten us, to give us a grace of revelation. Our parents are God's wonderful gift to us, as we are to them, but they're not the ones who can 'put us right with God'. Jesus is the One who came to reconcile us with the Father. Our parents gave us life but only Jesus can give us eternal life. When Jesus stood before Pontius Pilate at his trial, he made it clear that his 'kingdom is not of this world'. This didn't mean that his kingdom was not in this world! It certainly is, but it's a kingdom that the world hasn't known before.

Sea Sunday – 9 July
Seafarers and fishers play a vital role in all of our lives, but they often work in difficult, hazardous conditions. In the last year, more crews have been abandoned by their employers than ever before. Many are still being denied the right to leave their ships for even a short break away from the relentless noise and pressure onboard. Many are reporting more stress and poorer mental health. Sea Sunday is Sunday 9 July. It is when the Church prays for all those who live and work at sea. Your support will make a big difference to seafarers and fishers in need. You can donate in church, by visiting www.stellamaris.org.uk/donate, or by texting 'SEA' to 70460 to donate £5. This collection is vital to enable Stella Maris (formerly called Apostleship of the Sea) to continue its important work - so please give generously. Thank you.

Abortion destroys the most fundamental freedom, the freedom to live, and leaves so many women and men deeply hurting. If you do not come to Mass regularly then it might be better to defer your child's application until you are ready to make this commitment.

Matthew West from the Royal College of London will be playing the Organ followed by Stefan Weidner Pianist who is from Trinity Laban. Each performance will last approximately twenty minutes.
