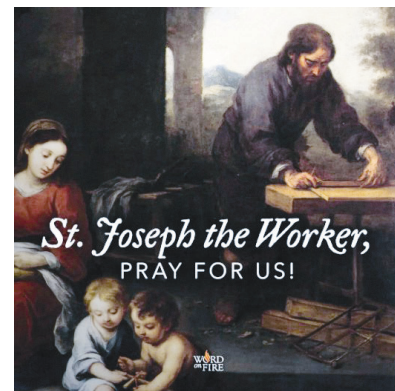

## IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Luke, in a story unique to his Gospel, gives an account of a remarkable and beautiful incident in Jesus' life. Some claim that the Mary before us today is Mary Magdalene, but scholars think that it's unlikely to be the same person, instead believing this woman to be a different Mary. What is clear is that, like Mary Magdalene, Mary of Bethany loved the Lord. In this account, she didn't wash his feet with her weeping or anoint his body with expensive nard: instead, she showed that one thing was needed: to sit at the Master's feet and learn from him.

There has always been a tension between the contemplative and apostolic arms of the Church. The contemplatives are accused of being too focused on prayer, whereas those engaged in the apostolate are criticized for being too preoccupied with social action and not placing enough emphasis on the interior life. Of course, this is overly simplistic, but, nevertheless, there's an element of truth in it.

It is, however, hard not to feel some sympathy for Martha, who here embodies the apostolic approach. She has no airs and graces, and is a worker, not a shirker. Clearly both women were serving the Lord, but Mary, in Jesus' own words, was doing it in a better way. This doesn't mean that what Martha was doing wasn't good or noble, or even the right thing for her to be doing: it simply means that ultimately, sitting at the Lord's feet and learning from him, he who is humble and gentle of heart, is the goal of our faith.

The great saints of the Church did not hesitate to serve others practically. It was said of St. Catherine of Genoa, for example, that she used to be so preoccupied in prayer that she appeared to be in a trance. However, if others needed her, she would stop praying immediately to respond. Pope Francis is calling us all to serve others in a spirit of love and charity, but this must first be rooted in prayer and hearing God speak through his Word. *Lord, grant me your peace and clarity so that I may, like Mary, sit at your feet every day and learn from you*

Pope Francis reminds us "Jesus gives us little in the way of talking points but focuses his command on how they should be: on the witness to give more than the words". Jesus defines them as workers. They are therefore required to work, to work to evangelise through their behaviour. The pope continues "it is primarily the very life of all of us to announce the Gospel: their knowing how to be together with mutual respect. He has asked us to pray that the Blessed Virgin Mary might help all

Christ's disciples' to prepare the way for the Lord with witnesses of fraternity". For each one of us we need to ask ourselves in all honesty - What time do we give to prayer with our families? How often do we read and reflect on the word of God? How we see the importance of fulfilling our Sunday Obligation of attending Holy Mass on Sundays and on days of very special feast days? Do we encourage members of our families and our extended families to observe the commandment of keeping the Sunday Holy? Even if we are away from home or on holiday, Sunday Mass is an obligation. Do we pray for the sick and all who are in need? Do we pray for the Holy Souls in purgatory? In fact do we believe in purgatory or know about this state for our immortal souls after death? Do we openly live our Christian faith in thought, words and deeds?

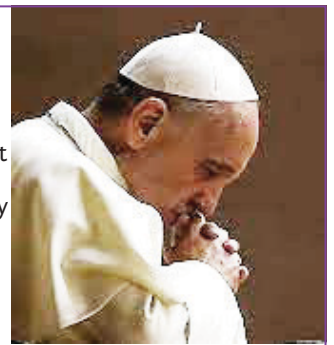
At Pentecost the call for the disciples was "Go out to the whole world and proclaim the good news". This is our challenge especially in our world today. However it begins in our homes (domestic church). In prayer. Every Sunday we have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 4.00 p.m. until 5.00 p.m. This is a quiet time with Jesus of even 10, 15 or 30 mins. 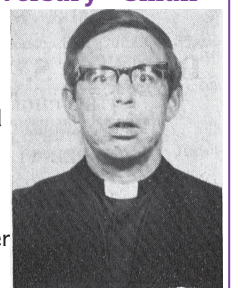
## Refreshments After 10.30 Mass

## March For Life: 3 September

This year marks the sad milestone of 10 million abortions in the UK since the 1967 Abortion Act. It is more important than ever that all people of goodwill, and especially Catholics, give public witness to the infinite dignity of human life.

We can do so at the annual March for Life held on Saturday 3 September. Bishop Sherrington will celebrate Mass at 11.00 a.m. at St. George's Cathedral, Southwark. Priests are welcome to concelebrate. LifeFest22 is a pro-life, family-friendly festival held 10.30 a.m. - 1.30 p.m. at the Emmanuel Centre, Marsham Street SW1P 3DW. The March itself starts at the Emmanuel Centre at 2.00 p.m., proceeding to Parliament Square, where there will be testimony and speeches, with the day concluding at 4.30 p.m. More information can be found at <https://www.marchforlife.co.uk/> Our witness is vital. ## Visiting the lonely elderly

The second World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly will be celebrated in a situation in which in many countries the health emergency has ended, which will allow initiatives to be taken with greater freedom and to put personal encounter and embrace at the center of each one. In order for the message of closeness and consolation that the Day wants to express to reach everyone - even those who are most isolated - we ask people to make a visit to their grandparents and the lonely elderly in their community and to deliver the Holy Father's message to them.

The visit, a tangible sign of the outgoing Church, is a way to reaffirm that the elderly, even the loneliest, are at the center of our communities. The visit shows the personal choice to get up and go quickly to others (cf. Lk. 1:39), just as Mary did to visit the elderly Elizabeth.

The visit can be an opportunity to bring a gift, such as a flower, and to read the Day's prayer together.

Visiting a lonely elderly person is one of the possibilities for obtaining the Plenary Indulgence granted on the occasion of the Day. The encounter between young and old, the friendship that can result, is one of the signs that "In old age they will still bear fruit." Anyone able to offer a lift to elderly, please contact Mary our parish administrator.

## Journey Home – Threshold Of Hope

Our Catholic Faith from Catechism of the Catholic Church

### Second Commandment

'You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain'.

This commandment prescribes respect for the Lord's name. Respect for his name is an expression of the respect owed to the mystery of God himself and to the whole sacred reality it evolves.

The sense of the sacred is part of the virtue of religion. The holiness of the divine name demands that we neither use it for trivial matters, nor take an oath which is based if the circumstances could be interpreted as approval of an authority unjustly requiring it. In Baptism the sacrament is conferred in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. In Baptism, the Lord's name sanctifies man, he the Christian receives the name of the church. This can be the name of a saint, a disciple who has lived an exemplary life to the Lord. The Christian begins his day, his prayers and activities with the sign of the cross. The baptised person dedicates the day to the glory of God and calls on the saviour's grace which lets him act in the spirit of the Father. The sign of the cross strengthens us in temptation and difficulties. God calls each one by name (Isaiah 43-17).
