A LIGHT-HEARTED LOOK AT OUR MUCH LOVED CHRISTMAS SONGS

The Union of Shepherds has complained that it breaches Health & Safety Regulations to insist the shepherds watch their flocks without appropriate seating arrangements being provided.

THE FULLNESS OF CHRISTIAN FAITH - CONTINUED

15. "Abraham rejoiced that he would see my day; he saw it and was glad" (Jn 8:56). According to these words of Jesus, Abraham's faith pointed to him; in some sense it foresaw his mystery. So Saint Augustine understood it when he stated that the patriarchs were saved by faith, not faith in Christ who had come but in Christ who was yet to come, a faith pressing toward the future of Jesus. Christian faith is centered on Christ; it is the confession that Jesus is Lord and that God has raised him from the dead (cf. Rom 10:9). All the threads of the Old Testament converge on Christ; he becomes the definitive "Yes" to all the promises, the ultimate basis of our "Amen" to God (cf. 2 Cor 1:20). The history of Jesus is the complete manifestation of God's reliability. If Israel continued to recall God's great acts of love, which formed the core of its confession of faith and broadened its gaze in faith, the life of Jesus now appears as the locus of God's definitive intervention, the supreme manifestation of his love for us. The word which God speaks to us in Jesus is not simply one word among many, but his eternal Word (cf. Heb 1:1-2). God can give no greater guarantee of his love, as Saint Paul reminds us (cf. Rom 8:31-39). Christian faith is thus faith in a perfect love, in its decisive power, in its ability to transform the world and to unfold its history. "We know and believe the love that God has for us" (1 Jn 4:16). In the love of God revealed in Jesus, faith perceives the foundation on which all reality and its final destiny rest.

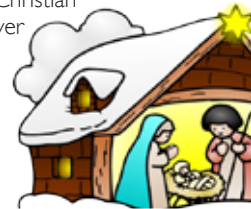
Fr. Leslie writes

A warm welcome to all our parishioners to our parish of St. Joseph the Worker. According to our tradition, Advent addresses the three comings of our Lord:



his coming in history; his coming at the end of time; and his coming into our hearts here and now.

The beginning of advent always has its focus on the final days. The preparation for the coming of the Christ as the child of Bethlehem is linked to the coming of Christ on the last day. Today all three of our readings have that emphasis, but each applies in a different way. The wonderful vision of Isaiah is a utopian vision - all peoples come to learn the ways of God, and rivalry will be over. It is a passage full of hope and promise. St. Paul uses the promise, in the second reading, of the coming of daylight as the reason to call his listeners to a better way of life. In the gospel the expected coming is a warning to be prepared because no one knows the hour, or who will be saved. The reality of the second coming is something very much part of Christian theology and worship. In Eucharistic prayer three we say "as we look forward to his second coming". And that should be our reason for hope - that is the promise of salvation. But it is also a call to live already, here and now, as people redeemed by the Lord who is already with us. The challenge of Jesus is to "stay awake".



As we begin advent let us try to make it a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord into our hearts, so that we will be ready for him whenever he comes.
