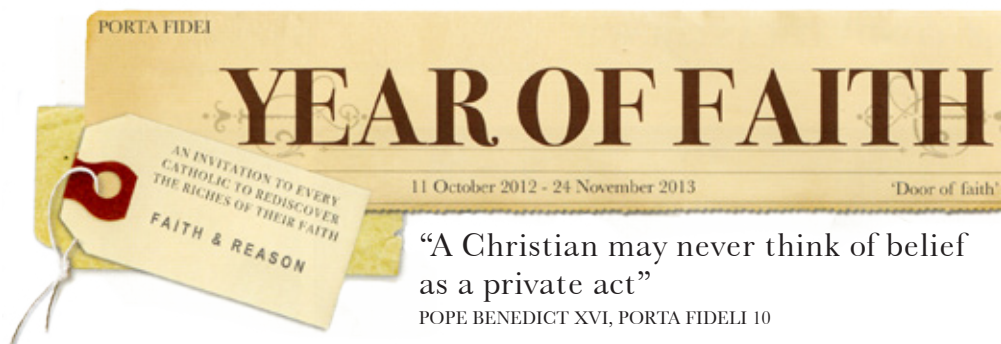

A NEW JOURNEY

In October 2011, Pope Benedict XVI announced a “Year of Faith” inviting Catholics to rediscover the gift of faith and to seek new ways of proclaiming it. The Year of Faith will begin on 11 October 2012, the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council. Everyone is invited to participate in this Year of celebration and mission, mindful that faith is not meant to be private, but professed and shared. Please do support it and get involved as you can.

Over the next four weeks we will publish a series of articles on the four pillars of the Year of Faith – Catechism, Conversion, Charity and New Evangelisation.

CATECHISM

“In order to arrive at a systematic knowledge of the content of the faith, all can find in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, a precious and indispensable tool”.

PORTA FIDEI 11

Twenty years ago Blessed Pope John Paul II published the Catechism of the Catholic Church. He wrote at the time: “...this catechism will make a very important contribution to that work of renewing the whole life of the Church ... I declare it to be a valid and legitimate instrument for ecclesial communion and a sure norm for teaching the faith.” *Fidei Depositum*, IV

During the Year of Faith every baptised person is invited to re-read the Catechism to deepen their understanding and appreciation of the most important gift that they’ve been given - their faith. The Catechism helps everyone to learn about the content of the faith as received and safeguarded by the Church during the past 2000 years.

Pope Benedict XVI writes in his Apostolic Letter announcing the Year: “From Sacred Scripture to the Fathers of the Church, from theological masters to the saints across the centuries, the Catechism provides a permanent record of the many ways in which the Church has meditated on the faith and made progress in doctrine so as to offer certitude to believers in their lives of faith.” *Porta Fidei* 11

Welcome to our Parish of St. Joseph the Worker

Welcome to our parish of St Joseph the worker. Today our Scripture readings return to Mark. In the Gospel, Jesus chastises the Pharisees. It is not because of their fidelity to religious observances and ritual tradition, because Jesus also did this as part of his upbringing, but it had to be lived according to our hearts also not just in words and actions. It was to demonstrate our love for God that bears fruit in charity. In his teaching Jesus highlights a problem with the practice of faith by telling them to look into their hearts and not just the externals. Today's Responsorial Psalm promises that all who "do justice" will live in the Lord's presence. Let us come into God's presence renewing our resolve to become a more just and faithful people, a people holy to the Lord.

This month we begin shortly our children's preparation for Holy Communion. This wonderful gift of Jesus which we have all heard in the past few weeks of John's Gospel on the theme of the bread of life. All Catholics, as we grow from our earliest years into a personal relationship with Jesus, are drawn into the community of the family of God as we celebrate his presence in our lives and are fed with his body and blood day by day. Each day we are challenged to follow the road that leads us to Eternal Life by taking up our cross every day and following Jesus

He adds: "In its very structure, the Catechism of the Catholic Church follows the development of the faith right up to the great themes of daily life. On page after page, we find that what is presented here is no theory, but an encounter with a Person who lives within the Church. The profession of faith is followed by an account of sacramental life, in which Christ is present, operative and continues to build his Church. Without the liturgy and the sacraments, the profession of faith would lack efficacy, because it would lack the grace which supports Christian witness. By the same criterion, the teaching of the Catechism on the moral life acquires its full meaning if placed in relationship with faith, liturgy and prayer." Porta Fidei II

The Catechism of the Catholic Church is offered as an indispensable tool to support growth in faith. Some parishes already have groups that meet at intervals to read and study this text. During the Year of Faith you may choose to start such a group and/or commit to reading a paragraph daily as a way of deepening your appreciation of the Church's teaching

HOME MISSION SUNDAY - A LETTER FROM BISHOP KIERAN CONROY

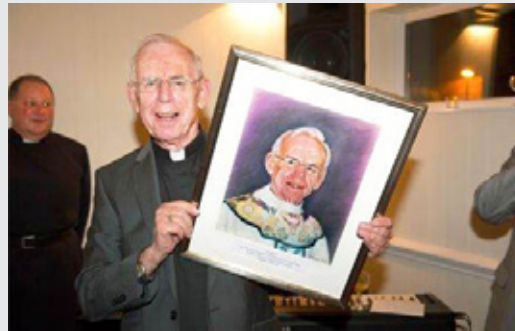
Home Mission Sunday takes place on 16 September 2012 and is a day when the Catholic community in England and Wales is invited to pray for, celebrate and support the work of evangelisation in England and Wales.

This year's theme is 'Confident in Faith' and is intimately connected to the opening of the Year of Faith which will happen just over three weeks after Home Mission Sunday on 11 October. One of the purposes of the Year is to invite the baptised to rediscover and be more confident in their faith. This is what St. Peter demonstrates so powerfully in the Gospel for Home Mission Sunday, proclaiming "You are the Christ" (Mark 8: 27 - 35). The more confidence we have in Jesus Christ as Our Lord and Saviour, the more ready and equipped we are to share the treasure of our Catholic Faith.

The second collection that parishes are invited to have on Home Mission Sunday directly supports the work of the Bishops' Department for Evangelisation and Catechesis, with an important instrument being the Home Mission Desk.
