Welcome to our parish of St Joseph the Worker. Today we celebrate All Saints. When we reflect on the readings we are told that the goal, purpose and meaning of life is to be holy, to be a saint. Nowhere in the New Testament is this central teaching expressed more clearly or more beautifully than in Jesus' teaching in the Beatitudes. Today we celebrate and rejoice in the saints in heaven, who during their lives on Earth lived out the Beatitudes. We ask for their intercession and study the witness of their lives.

The Saints gave us hope because they show that by God's grace we can rise above our human nature and live lives that are truly pleasing to him. Most of us wake up each day with a list of things we need to do and achieve. We are largely driven by the here and now, the immediate and urgent. This is understandable, as is the reason why Jesus invites us to draw near to him, for he is meek, humble and lowly of heart and he gives rest to our souls.

The cry of the Saint every day is, Lord, make me a saint. To be a saint is in the ordinary everyday life that we become a saint. Holiness is being immersed in daily living. Holiness is praying for ourselves and others, letting go of resentment, repenting of our sin, striving to serve others; it is being joyful, optimistic, hopeful, striving to see the good in others and recognising that every human being is created in the image and likeness of God. When we strive to be Saints, God pours his spirit out upon us and we are filled with joy, hope and enthusiasm and live as the blessing children of God.

Tomorrow we remember the faithful departed - our relatives and friends, colleagues and others we know who have passed over from this world to the next and are in Purgatory. We pray for their souls and for their passage into the joy of heaven. Incidentally that is why it is customary to have a Mass said for the holy souls of our family and friends. This practice of praying for the dead was rooted in Judaism. In 2 Maccabees we read "therefore Judas Maccabee made atonement for the dead, that they may be released from their sins". That is why the church in her wisdom has always encouraged us to offer prayers for the dead. Lord today as we commemorate our dead, we ask that our prayers may bring them consolation as they prepare to enter the eternal joy of the beautiful vision.
