APOSTOLIC LETTER "MOTU PROPRIO DATA"

PORTA FIDEI OF THE SUPREME PONTIFF BENEDICT XVI - FOR THE INDICTION OF THE YEAR OF FAITH

CONTINUATION OF "PORTA FIDEI" (DOOR OF FAITH)
CONGREGATION FOR THE DOCTRINE OF THE FAITH

1. On the level of the Universal Church
1. The main ecclesial event at the beginning of the Year of Faith will be the XIII General Assembly of the Ordinary Synod of Bishops, convoked by Pope Benedict XVI in October 2012, dedicated to The New Evangelization for the Transmission of the Christian Faith. During this Synod, on 11 October 2012, there will be a solemn celebration of the beginning of the Year of Faith, in remembrance of the fiftieth anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council.
2. In the Year of Faith pilgrimages of the faithful to the See of Peter are to be encouraged, to profess faith in God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, in unity with him who today is called to confirm his brothers and sisters in the faith. It is also important to promote pilgrimages to the Holy Land, the place which first saw the presence of Jesus, the Saviour, and Mary, his Mother.
3. During this Year, it will be helpful to invite the faithful to turn with particular devotion to Mary, model of the Church, who "shines forth to the whole community of the elect as the model of virtues." Therefore, every initiative that helps the faithful to recognize the special role of Mary in the mystery of salvation, love her and follow her as a model of faith and virtue is to be encouraged. To this end it would be proper to organize pilgrimages, celebrations and gatherings at the major Marian shrines.
4. The next World Youth Day, in Rio de Janeiro in July 2013, will offer a special occasion for the young to experience the joy which comes from faith in the Lord Jesus and communion with the Holy Father, in the greater family of the Church.
5. It is hoped that many symposia, conferences and large gatherings will be held, even at the international level, to encourage encounters with authentic witness to the faith and to promote understanding of the contents of Catholic doctrine. Noting how, still today, the Word of God continues to grow and spread, it will be important to give witness that "all the anguish and all the longing of the human heart finds fulfilment" in Christ Jesus and that faith "becomes a new criterion of understanding and action that changes the whole of man's life." Some conferences should be particularly dedicated to the rediscovery of the teachings of Vatican Council II.

Welcome to our parishioners, visitors and new parishioners. I hope you all had a good week. The wonderful Easter season seems to be passing quickly and we will soon have the First Holy Communion of our

children. This is always a truly wonderful day for the parish and our families. Also the month of May is almost upon us. It is the month of Mary. I want to encourage you, as a family, to pray the rosary or at least one decade each day.

Today's liturgy teaches us that the two significant fruits of being a disciple of Jesus are peace and courage. We can know these two blessings in our lives in a real and tangible way. This must be true because Jesus taught and promised: "Peace I leave with you, My peace I give you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid".

When we examine our lives, so often we find turmoil instead of peace. We seem to have a fear of life instead of courage. Our faith is precisely faith. The key is the Holy Spirit whom the "Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and remind you of all that I have said".

To understand this we need to reflect on the scriptures and to pray the words that we read. At Mass we receive the peace of Christ which we as the body of Christ extend to one another. This should be given with a sincere desire to give Christ's peace to each other. It is the moment before we come to receive Jesus, the Prince of Peace, into our hearts and lives. It is such a gift. Let us receive it with grateful and open hearts.

MY JOURNEY OF FAITH by Nikki Da Costa-Smith

Some people say everything happens for a reason, others say it is fate and if you are Catholic you believe it is the Holy Spirit that guides you through life, this is my interpretation of my experiences and beliefs and how they have changed through my journey of faith.

I first started attending church two years ago when my eldest daughter asked to be baptised. Both of my children attended a Catholic school but as a family we were not religious so I hadn't personally had much exposure to the religion. At the time my life was going along quite nicely and I no reason to think the church would bring anything into my life that I didn't have.

I had always been bought up with good ethics with strong morals with my parents instilling the importance of good manners and respect for others so I loved the fact the Catholic ethos of the school was firmly built on these beliefs but I hadn't ever really looked at the religion too closely. So when my daughter asked to be baptised I wanted to find out more so that I could fully support her.

When I first spoke to Father Leslie about signing up for the RCIA he was very supportive but stressed that I had to do it for me and not for my daughter and that becoming a Catholic is something that you cannot do for someone else. At the time I didn't really understand what he meant but I do now as the benefits that I have received are personal to me, as is my relationship with God.

At first my attendance on the RCIA course was simply a fact finding mission. In fact both Lisa and Katie have commented on my attitude when I started and subsequently how it changed over the months. I think it is fair to say that I asked more questions than anyone else on the course and was probably quite challenging to start with, but Gabrielle the rcia leader was amazing and encouraged all questions and debates. Gabrielle accepted me as I was, answering everything honestly and didn't try to force any views onto me. I found this very refreshing as I had always been lead to believe through various forms of media that the Catholic Religion was there to be followed with no questions asked, which is simply not the case at all.

My sponsor Alison has been a constant source of support throughout the course happy to listen to me whenever I needed an ear to listen. In fact, everyone who I have met through the church and its local community has been so welcoming which has strengthened my belief further that above all else God is love.

I'm not sure at what point things changed but there was a definite shift from learning the facts to wanting to know as much as I could and taking comfort from what the religion brought to my life. During this period I and my family have had to face various challenges that have caused a great deal of stress and upset but because of my faith I now believe that God will look after us. Because of my faith I now concentrate on all of the things I am thankful for, my supportive family, my loving husband Craig, my two beautiful children Isabella and Lucia, our health and Gods love. I do not think I would have been able to do this if it hadn't been for learning and understanding what the Catholic faith focuses on.

Without my daughter wanting to become a Catholic when she did I would have never have found the comfort that religion brought me when I was going through a difficult time in my life, and it gives me great joy to think that my children will grow up with the Catholic faith to support and guide them through life also.

So if you were to ask me now whether I believe that everything happens for a reason, or were it fate or the Holy Spirit that guides you, I can say with honesty that I now believe it is the Holy Spirit and Gods Love that guides and will see us through life's journey.
