Well the weather last Saturday was pretty poor but that didn't stop the Parish coming together to support Brentwood Catholic Children's Society in the annual walk to the Cathedral in Brentwood. There were 32 parishioners in attendance, plus Duke the Blue Roan Cocker Spaniel (who ended up getting very wet – he couldn't manage an umbrella!) and a good time was had by all on our gentle stroll into town. In all 21 parishes were involved in the Sponsored Walk, although not all of them walk to the Cathedral – some prefer a circular walk around their own parish. We were beaten to the Cathedral by Most Holy Redeemer parish, Harold Hill and St. Dominic's, Harold Hill, who were tucking in to their free lunch when we arrived, but happily there was more than enough left for us, and for the later arrivals, who included Billericay, Ilford, Chelmsford, Basildon, Benfleet and Laindon. The Second Collection at St Joseph two weeks ago in aid of the walk raised £261.59 and a cheque for that amount has been sent to BCCS. Also some £256.00 has also been sent in respect of sponsorship monies, and I know there is quite a bit more to come in. If there are any outstanding sponsorship monies that you know about, then please let Ian or Father know. Thank you so much to everyone who took part, and thank you to all sponsors and donors. Your generosity will make a huge difference.

**Welcome to our parish of St. Joseph the Worker**

In the Acts of the Apostles, the church's former "Chief Persecutor" gets off to a shaky start - all the disciples fear him; none accept his conversion as authentic. Barnabas takes this unwelcome convert under his wing, securing Paul's acceptance first by the Apostles, then by a community amazed by Paul's bold witnessing to Jesus and willingness to face death for the faith he once tried to exterminate.

The point for us: now as then, the community grows in the measure and to the extent that we dare to receive, accept and even welcome as gifts from the spirit all those - especially the most unexpected and unlikely - who are drawn to Jesus, the Lord of new beginnings and second chances. A wise and wonderful confessor counselled his penitents: "Always make it easy for someone to say "I'm sorry!" After all, look how easy Jesus has made it for us!

First John confirms the Acts of the Apostles message and points towards today's Gospel. For disciples, love dare not be "word or speech" only, but "deed and truth". The key to moving past a guilty conscience is keeping God's Commandments. In other words doing what pleases him, specially, having faith, (believing in the name of his Son) and doing faith (love one another).

When Jesus saw two of John's disciples following him, he asked the same question the Church asks people presenting themselves or their children for baptism. "What are you looking for?" They answer - "Where are you?" Jesus responds - "Come and see!" Jesus tells the disciples at the Last Supper "Remain in me". It is remaining in me that gives us true peace.

Therefore in today's celebration of the Eucharist we pray that we may glorify God by bearing much fruit and becoming more faithful disciples of the Risen Lord.

Desmond remained positive during his illness, believing absolutely in "The Power of Prayer", a belief which sustained him and Kath throughout.
