**Fr. Leslie writes**

We welcome you to St Joseph the Worker parish. Today we celebrate the 14th Sunday of the year.

This newsletter will be the last edition until late summer. It will resume on the

weekend of 23/24 August. However the Mass Intention requests will be put up on the Notice Board in the Church porch for the weekends when there are no newsletters.

Friday 15 August is the feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Mass Times will be 9.15 a.m. and 7.30 p.m. This is a Holy Day of Obligation.

I am looking into the cost of refurbishing the Cross outside the Church which has become rather weather-beaten over the years. I would also like to refurbish the statue of our Lady of Walsingham. On both these projects I will keep you updated.

During the week beginning 7 July the Parish will have its annual Health and Safety check by Precision.

Today we resume our numbered Sunday's in ordinary time, having celebrated all the Sundays of Lent, Easter, and the feast days that followed since the last time we observed a Sunday in ordinary time. So let us gather, grateful for God's presence in times both extraordinary and ordinary.

The Gospel reading reveals a wonderful truth about God and his nature. These words of Jesus come straight from God's own heart and it is as if it were God speaking to us. Jesus teaches us that God the Father delights to pour out to a gift of revelation upon his children. In the Christian faith we have the ancient revelation of Scripture, the Creed and the teaching of the church, and it is in these truths that we immerse our minds and hearts. Here the Holy Spirit opens up our minds and hearts to see hidden depths, a new meaning, a fresh interpretation or a word or nuance which touches us deeply and moves us to love and worship God. This is our birthright of our baptism. This is why we need to make space to pray, to read the Scriptures (hence the importance of "Bible Alive" on sale at the back of the church which includes day-to-day readings from the Scriptures) and to be still before the Lord. Prayer is a time set aside to invest in the grace of revelation. This is the desire of the Father's heart. Hence we come to know God's joy.

Thank you, have a good Sunday and a wonderful summer.

**SOCIETY OF SAINT GREGORY - ANNUAL RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL**

This year the Society of Saint Gregory is holding its Annual Residential Summer School at the Hayes Conference Centre, Swanwick, Derbyshire from 28 July to 1 August. The theme of this year's Summer School is - "A sure compass by which to take our bearings, exploring how Vatican II is a sure compass for liturgical practice and the life of the church".

Leaders include Director of Music - Frances Novillo; Director of Liturgy - Kathryn Turner; and Keynote Speaker - Rev Fr Kevin McGinnell, Episcopal Vicar for Education and Formation of the Diocese of Northampton and Chair of the Joint Liturgical Group of Great Britain. The Summer School includes a programme of talks and workshops, in which to practice and develop all liturgical and musical skills, as well as opportunities for rest, recollection and socialising. Following on from last year's success the society is offering 15 free places to any 18-35 year old interested in attending the Summer School. **CAFOD CONNECT2 PROJECT CHANGE**

For several years our parish has supported CAFOD's work in Rwanda through the Connect2 scheme. Your support and donations (in the Connect2 Rwanda collection box at the back of the church) have helped CAFOD and their partners in Musha in Rwanda with their work to help communities heal after the atrocities of the 1994 genocide. A big thank you once again to everyone who has donated to this project. CAFOD, however, is consistently assessing where there is the greatest need for its money to be spent and, as a result of the success of its projects in Rwanda over the last 20 years, its work in the community in Musha is coming to a close. We are therefore proposing to move our parish's support to a new CAFOD Connect2 project in El Salvador. Most people in El Salvador live on less than a dollar a day. Puentecitos is a small village situated in the west of El Salvador where people are building a better future for themselves with the help of CAFOD and its partner, the Jesuit Development Service. By becoming part of the Connect2 El Salvador scheme, St. Joseph the Worker will be able to support the people of Puentecitos to earn more money through better farming and establishing small businesses, and to grow more nourishing food to improve health, especially among children.
