We welcome you to St Joseph the Worker in this lovely Season of Advent. Today's Liturgy of the Word is a call to repentance. In the reading from Isaiah we are given a beautiful image of God as he expresses his concern for the people. "Console my people, console them, says your God. Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for".

Isaiah is asking the people to prepare for the Lord, and uses the image of the mountain and the Valley as he urges them to make level the obstacles that keep them from God. They need to make way for God to enter their lives. He compares God to a shepherd who feeds his flock and carries them in his arms. Such is God's love for his people, that he

does not wish anyone to stray from his immense love. As Isaiah called the people to prepare their hearts for the coming of the Lord, so we are called today to level the rough areas of our lives and allow ourselves to be embraced in the arms of the shepherd who feeds his flock and gathers the lambs in his arms.

In the gospel we are introduced to John the Baptist, one of the key advent figures. He repeats Isaiah's call to "prepare the way for the Lord". Repentance is at the heart of John's message and today we are challenged to listen and respond to his call as we prepare the way of the Lord's coming into our lives.

The people respond to his call asking for baptism and confessing their sins. Let us reflect this week on our own baptism and how our lives are witness to John's call to inner conversion as we await the coming of the Lord.

During this Advent season a question we may consider might be "how might my thoughts, words and actions become more rooted and be transformed by God's living word".

## Preparing for Christmas Through the Advent Season

Amid the frenetic preparation for the celebration of the birth of our Saviour, let us make time spiritually to welcome Jesus into our hearts and lives.

- ♦ Morning Mass is celebrated each morning here at St Joseph's. In the city you may be near a church which has midday Mass.
- ♦ Celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This Sacrament can be celebrated in any church of your choosing or here at St Joseph's on Saturday mornings after morning Mass.
- ♦ Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament every morning except Wednesday before morning Mass. Parents, on your way to school do call in for a few moments with your children.
- ♦ You are invited to enter into a deeper relationship with Jesus through prayer. Besides the celebration of the Eucharist, you could purchase "Walk with Me" Advent reflection, easily put into your pocket.
- ♦ "Bible Alive" can also help you explore the wonderful Advent readings each day through God's word.
- ♦ The Rosary - a prayer to Mary on the life of her Son. Perhaps the intention can be for "the Conversion of England"
- ♦ Advent talks with other faiths - see notice board at the back of the church. Whichever way you choose to celebrate the Season of Advent, we pray that we may draw ever closer in mind and heart to Jesus, our Saviour and Redeemer. So that on Christmas Day our gift to Jesus is our unending love.
