CONTINUING POPE BENEDICT'S LETTER ON CHARITY AND TRUTH

FAITH AND REASON IN THE APPROACH TO SCRIPTURE

I believe that what Pope John Paul II wrote about this question in his Encyclical *Fides et Ratio* can lead to a fuller understanding of exegesis and its relationship to the whole of theology. He stated that we should not underestimate "the danger inherent in seeking to derive the truth of sacred Scripture from the use of one method alone, ignoring the need for a more comprehensive exegesis which enables the exegete, together with the whole Church, to arrive at the full sense of the texts. Those who devote themselves to the study of sacred Scripture should always remember that the various hermeneutical approaches have their own philosophical underpinnings, which need to be carefully evaluated before they are applied to the sacred texts".

This far-sighted reflection enables us to see how a hermeneutical approach to sacred Scripture inevitably brings into play the proper relationship between faith and reason. Indeed, the secularized hermeneutic of sacred Scripture is the product of reason's attempt structurally to exclude any possibility that God might enter into our lives and speak to us in human words. Here too, we need to urge a broadening of the scope of reason. In applying methods of historical analysis, no criteria should be adopted which would rule out in advance God's self-disclosure in human history. The unity of the two levels at work in the interpretation of sacred Scripture presupposes, in a word, the harmony of faith and reason. On the one hand, it calls for a faith which, by maintaining a proper relationship with right reason, never degenerates into fideism, which in the case of Scripture would end up in fundamentalism. On the other hand, it calls for a reason which, in its investigation of the historical elements present in the Bible, is marked by openness and does not reject a priori anything beyond its own terms of reference. In any case, the religion of the incarnate Logos can hardly fail to appear profoundly reasonable to anyone who sincerely seeks the truth and the ultimate meaning of his or her own life and history.

Welcome to our parish of St. Joseph the Worker

Today we celebrate the sixth Sunday of the year:

In the Gospel today we hear how a leper came to Jesus. He knelt down and asked Jesus to heal him. Jesus took pity on him and he was cured. Jesus told him not to tell anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest as Moses commanded, for proof to the people. But he talked about it openly and spread the news. The result was that Jesus could not enter a town but was forced to be out in the country. Jesus became the outcast.

Leprosy was one of the most repugnant and most feared diseases of ancient times. The leper came to Jesus with great faith, and his faith is rewarded by his healing. Jesus shows that he regards compassion as more important than the ritual prohibitions against contact with the disease. Lepers were the supreme outcasts of Jesus' day. Their presence was feared and hated. Yet Jesus was there for the lepers as he was for others despised by society.

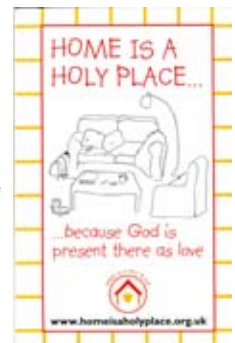
Today our leprosy is sin. Habitual sin can spread and make us unhappy and estranged from God. As the season of Lent approaches we have the opportunity to come to Jesus and, like the leper, kneel down and ask Jesus to heal us of our sin. We all need to experience the healing touch of Jesus on our souls.

Lent is also the time to hear the word of God afresh in our lives. We sell the booklet "Bible Alive" which gives us the scripture reflection on the readings of the day.

This could be one of our Lenten resolutions, to read daily a portion of scripture from this booklet. We all need to feed our immortal souls with prayer and the Word of God. We ask Jesus for his healing hand in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and to open our hearts to hear His word spoken to us today.
