### APOSTOLIC LETTER "MOTU PROPRIO DATA"

### PORTA FIDEI OF THE SUPREME PONTIFF BENEDICT XVI - FOR THE INDICTION OF THE YEAR OF FAITH

CONTINUATION OF "PORTA FIDEI" (DOOR OF FAITH)

CONGREGATION FOR THE DOCTRINE OF THE FAITH

After the Council the Church - under the sure guidance of the Magisterium and in continuity with the whole Tradition - set about ensuring the reception and application of the teaching of the Council in all its richness. To assist in the correct reception of the Council, the Popes have frequently convoked the Synod of Bishops, first instituted by the Servant of God, Paul VI, in 1965, providing the Church with clear guidance through the various post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortations. The next General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, to be held in October 2012, will have as its theme: The New Evangelization for the Transmission of the Christian Faith.

From the beginning of his pontificate, Pope Benedict XVI has worked decisively for a correct understanding of the Council, rejecting as erroneous the so-called "hermeneutic of discontinuity and rupture" and promoting what he himself has termed "the 'hermeneutic of reform', of renewal in the continuity of the one subject-Church which the Lord has given to us. She is a subject which increases in time and develops, yet always remaining the same, the one subject of the journeying People of God."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church in this same vein, is both an "authentic fruit of Vatican Council II" and a tool for aiding in its reception. The Extraordinary Synod of Bishops of 1985, convoked on the occasion of the twentieth anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Council and to measure its reception, suggested the preparation of a Catechism in order to offer the People of God a compendium of all Catholic doctrine and a sure point of reference for local catechisms. Pope John Paul II accepted this proposal as a desire which "fully responds to a real need of the universal Church and of the particular Churches". Compiled in collaboration with the entire Episcopate of the Catholic Church, this Catechism "truly expresses what could be called the symphony of the faith".

Fr. Leslie writes

Welcome to all our parishioners and visitors. I hope you enjoy our Sunday celebration today. It was so good to see so many visitors over Easter. They all thought we have a lovely homely community here at St Joseph. If you see someone next to you who you don't know, please make yourself known and them welcome.

There is a great poignancy in today's gospel. We meet the disciples – a group of the twelve who were called and followed Jesus – and they decided to go fishing. The way John writes the passage it is almost as if the whole time with Jesus had been forgotten and they have gone back. Back to the days when they were just fishermen. They, like the early days, caught nothing until Jesus appears and tells them what to do! But this is Jesus raised from the dead, and as usual, it is the disciple Jesus loves who makes the connection.

The second part of the gospel is the most poignant part, and should bring consolation and challenge to any disciple. We are familiar in Christian teaching with the idea of the Lord as being Judge who will come to judge the living and the dead. John gives us a powerful and moving insight into what that judgement looks like when Jesus is the judge. Three times Peter denies Jesus in the passion and now here he asked three times "do you love me"? Peter knows his guilt, and yet when judgement is announced the sentence for failure is "Follow me". The only criteria is that we love Jesus.

**My Journey of Faith by Katie Kent.**

"When I was born, complications meant that I did not breathe for over half an hour, and the midwife in attendance baptised me in case I didn't live. The brain damage that I sustained due to this oxygen starvation rendered me unsteady, and I was bullied at primary school. Therefore, my parents and I decided that I should attend a different secondary school to the bullies. Thus, I went to Grays Convent, where I learnt about the Catholic Faith and nearly converted. After leaving school, I left religion behind. This was an unhappy period as I often felt my life lacked direction: I was burdened with family troubles and suffered from depression. My life completely changed when I met my husband, Tony, who is a practising Catholic. I started going to mass with him and I much admired his faith. Subconsciously, my faith began to grow, and I found myself praying to God and Jesus when I had a problem or needed guidance. After witnessing my father-in-law's conversion last Easter, it dawned on me just how deep my faith had become and I decided to embark on the RCIA course, which has strengthened my faith and increased my understanding of what it is to be a Catholic today.

I felt very emotional during the run-up to the Easter vigil, but on the day, I was surprisingly calm. I had experienced feelings of unworthiness during the time of the Rite of Election and I was waiting for someone to tell me that I could not become a Catholic. However, during Lent and Holy Week, my understanding of Jesus' sacrifice grew and I finally realized just how much He loves me. I could not wait to be baptized, confirmed and receive the Eucharist all on the same evening. The service was just beautiful and I really did feel reborn afterwards. Newly anointed, with my white shawl draped round my shoulders, I am sure I felt the same elation and excitement about my new life as those early converts did. I will always cherish my joyful memories of that evening and as I think back to it now, all I can see are the beaming faces of my fellow candidates, Lisa and Nikki. It is an evening that I shall remember until the end of my days".
