Welcome to our Parish of St. Joseph the Worker

Today is the actual date of my Ordination to the Priesthood. Please come into the hall after the 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Mass today for coffee and "delights". I would like to thank the organising committee and all who have had any part in all the preparation for the celebration for my 40th Anniversary. As this is written before the event, I will convey my deepest appreciation when I return from holiday on 17 August. Whilst I'm away there will be no weekly newsletters - for the present a big "thank you".

Today we have been called together as God's holy people to hear the word of God and to share Jesus' Eucharistic sacrifice, the supper of the lamb. Again we open our hearts to the God who loves us. The next nine Sundays centre on a five week presentation of Jesus' Bread of Life discourse in St. John's Gospel. We go out from Jesus; we return to Jesus. Worship strengthens for witness; worship compels our return to worship. Jesus sends the disciples out on a mission and upon their return, they witness first-hand his compassion (16th Sunday).

This example of Jesus' compassion in Mark dovetails with John's portrayal of his compassion manifested in Jesus' feeding of the multitude (17th Sunday). This feeding, in turn, points us towards the sign of Jesus as the living and life-giving bread (18th, 19th and 20th Sundays).

Today the Lord calls Amos and calls him to bear prophetic witness. Now Jesus' mission becomes the mission of the twelve and our mission too. His instructions to them are also meant for us too. The God who calls us together to this liturgy will also send us forth from here to spread the Gospel message and to praise the Lord by our lives. May our worship both confirm us in faith and prepare us for mission.
