The fullness of Christian faith - continued

17. Christ's death discloses the utter reliability of God's love above all in the light of his resurrection. As the risen one, Christ is the trustworthy witness, deserving of faith (cf. Rev 1:5; Heb 2:17), and a solid support for our faith. "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile," says Saint Paul (1 Cor 15:17). Had the Father's love not caused Jesus to rise from the dead, had it not been able to restore his body to life, then it would not be a completely reliable love, capable of illuminating also the gloom of death. When Saint Paul describes his new life in Christ, he speaks of "faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" (Gal 2:20). Clearly, this "faith in the Son of God" means Paul's faith in Jesus, but it also presumes that Jesus himself is worthy of faith, based not only on his having loved us even unto death, but also on his divine sonship. Precisely because lesus is the Son, because he is absolutely grounded in the Father, he was able to conquer death and make the fullness of life shine forth. Our culture has lost its sense of God's tangible presence and activity in our world. We think that God is to be found in the beyond, on another level of reality, far removed from our everyday relationships. But if this were the case, if God could not act in the world, his love would not be truly powerful, truly real, and thus not even true, a love capable of delivering the bliss that it promises. It would make no difference at all whether we believed in him or not. Christians, on the contrary, profess their faith in God's tangible and powerful love which really does act in history and determines its final destiny: a love that can be encountered, a love fully revealed in Christ's passion, death and resurrection.

Fr. Leslie writes

Welcome to all our parishioners and visitors. It is good that we have gathered together to give thanks to God for the week that has passed. We are now halfway

through Advent and preparing our hearts to celebrate the birth of our Saviour. We live in a culture where we expect everything to happen instantly. We get impatient if we have to wait. We are always in a hurry. To wait for someone or something implies a state of dependency, of lack of control over things. It is that which makes us feel uncomfortable, and leads to frustration. The letter of James is full of down-to-earth spiritual wisdom. The people in exile who received Israel's prophecy are those who wait for the Lord's coming and are offered three insights today.

The first is that they are waiting for an unknown but for a promise to be fulfilled. The second insight "strengthen all weary hearts". Have courage. The third insight is to look for the signs already, here and now. The disciples of John the Baptist come to Jesus; they have been waiting for the one who is to come. Jesus points out the signs - the blind see, the lame walk. Advent reminds us that we are a people waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. It unites us to hold on to those three insights. We are waiting for the total fulfilment of God's plan. While we wait we are engaged in strengthening one another, especially the weak, and we are invited to look for the signs that Christ is already amongst us.

Please note the Reconciliation Service at the Cathedral is this Wednesday at 7.30 p.m.

Remember Jesus never tires of forgiving us for our wrong choices.


