Welcome to our parish today – next Sunday is youth Sunday. I would like to encourage all our young people to come and join us. It will also be the last Sunday before we enter the holy

season of Advent. In this year of faith, please do send religious Christmas cards to your family, friends and neighbours. If you plan to leave cards at the back of the church, do ascertain that the recipients do come to St Joseph's and secondly that they have not already gone on holiday. Each year some cards are left and unfortunately end up in the bin!

In today's gospel the temple that Jesus' companions were admiring had been constructed under Herod the Great. It was the world's largest religious site and until today remains the largest man-made platform in the world. It was truly an awesome structure that we hear about in Ezekiel's vision. Yet Jesus remains unimpressed because he sees the transition of something as magnificent as this. The early believers had to suffer for their faith and in our time the martyrs of England and Wales.
