The sacraments and the transmission of faith

45. In the celebration of the sacraments, the Church hands down her memory especially through the profession of faith. The creed does not only involve giving one's assent to a body of abstract truths; rather, when it is recited the whole of life is drawn into a journey towards full communion with the living God. We can say that in the creed believers are invited to enter into the mystery which they profess and to be transformed by it. To understand what this means, let us look first at the contents of the creed. It has a trinitarian structure: the Father and the Son are united in the Spirit of love. The believer thus states that the core of all being, the inmost secret of all reality, is the divine communion. The creed also contains a christological confession: it takes us through all the mysteries of Christ's life up to his death, resurrection and ascension into heaven before his final return in glory. It tells us that this God of communion, reciprocal love between the Father and the Son in the Spirit, is capable of embracing all of human history and drawing it into the dynamic unity of the Godhead, which has its source and fulfillment in the Father. The believer who professes his or her faith is taken up, as it were, into the truth being professed. He or she cannot truthfully recite the words of the creed without being changed, without becoming part of that history of love which embraces us and expands our being, making it part of a great fellowship, the ultimate subject which recites the creed, namely, the Church. All the truths in which we believe point to the mystery of the new life of faith as a journey of communion with the living God.

Fr. Leslie writes

We welcome you to St Joseph the Worker on this Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. On Friday we celebrate the Feast of the most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Be amazed, be astounded and be incredulous at the gift of the Eucharist. But the tragedy is we fail to grasp the holiness, the sacredness and wonder of what it is we are receiving. Jesus meant us to be in awe. When we receive Holy Communion we are receiving Christ himself; when we celebrate the Eucharist, Jesus' passion, death and resurrection are actually made present in our midst. Through the action of the priest and the promise of Christ, the power of Jesus' saving death and resurrection is made available to us. Our role is simple; we enjoy, revere and worship the God-man who came down as living bread from heaven, and we can resolve to approach the Sacrament with a new appreciation and a fresh ardour. Food is for the body - the Eucharist for the soul. St John Vianney prayed and contemplated in front of the Blessed Sacrament for hours on end. This was where he was at his happiest and most content. This was where he gained his wisdom and insight into what is really the "source and summit of the Christian life". Without the Eucharist there would be no happiness, no love in this world.

When we contemplate with God in the prayer before the Eucharist, we lose ourselves in God like a drop in the ocean; in these vast depths of love, there is enough to lose yourself for eternity. There is nothing as great as the Eucharist. Today let us dedicate ourselves to the Eucharist and growing in wonder and amazement at this most precious gift of all gifts. Spend a few more moments in prayer after Mass. Come to Mass a few minutes earlier so we can pray and be still.

CAFOD, however, is consistently assessing where there is the greatest need for its money to be spent and, as a result of the success of its projects in Rwanda over the last 20 years, its work in the community in Musha is coming to a close. We are therefore proposing to move our parish's support to a new CAFOD Connect2 project in El Salvador. Most people in El Salvador live on less than a dollar a day. Puentecitos is a small village situated in the west of El Salvador where people are building a better future for themselves with the help of CAFOD and its partner, the Jesuit Development Service. By becoming part of the Connect2 El Salvador scheme, St. Joseph the Worker will be able to support the people of Puentecitos to earn more money through better farming and establishing small businesses, and to grow more nourishing food to improve health, especially among children.
