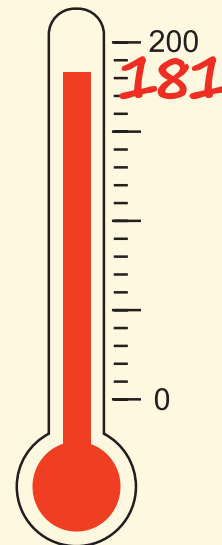
We stand on the cusp of celebrating the Church’s greatest mystery - the birth of God made man, the Word made flesh, Immanuel, God with us. We learn from the Scriptures that we enter this great mystery of faith through Mary (to Jesus).



God’s plan from the very beginning, at the dawn of creation, was to send his Son as King and Lord. Through the wrongful exercise of our wonderful gift of free will, which the fathers of the Church refer to its results as the Fall, this plan was thwarted. However, the priestly scribes who wrote the first few chapters of the Bible under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, spoke of a woman: ‘And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head and you will strike his heel’. This verse from Genesis is referred to as the protoevangelium – the first gospel – because traditionally the woman and her offspring have been understood to mean Mary and her Son. As the apostle Paul explained: ‘But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship’.

It is precisely this sacred moment in human and salvation history that Luke so beautifully, so eloquently and so powerfully narrates for us today. We can’t stand before this mystery: we must bow before it, and the lower we bow, the greater the revelation we receive. The more we believe, the greater our understanding will be because we are touching the very mystery of God’s divine plan to redeem the human race. This is why Advent is such a season of wonder and joy, and a time of great hope, because unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given, and he will be called Mighty God, Wonderful Counsellor and Prince of Peace. This is why we need to carve out a brief space to contemplate the birth of Jesus, and give praise and thanks for Mary’s ‘Yes’ to be the Mother of God, our mother in faith.

Welcome to St. Joseph the Worker to all our parishioners and visitors.

On this the fourth Sunday of Advent we are at last brought before the events leading directly up to the Christmas celebration of Jesus' birth, through the account in the gospel of the Annunciation of Mary. This story takes us into the world of the infancy narrative. Gabriel's announcement to Mary comes in two aspects, separated by a query of her past. After the greeting and assurance, Mary is told she is to be the mother of a child – the long-awaited Messiah (Son of the Most High). Mary asks in her current situation how this can come about?



The Angel's explanation lifts everything to a new transcendental level. The birth will come about by the "overshadowed" of God's Holy Spirit. Thus the child to be born from her will be God's son in a unique way. The God who did not want to live in a house built by David will come to live among us. Central to all this is Mary's faith as her cousin Elizabeth will later remark "Blessed is the she who believes that the promise made to her would be fulfilled".

For us today we journey by faith in God's word and comforted in all our difficulties, disappointments, and sorrows in the knowledge that we believe that he dwells among us.

Today we pray this beautiful hymn:

O very God of very God  
and very light of light  
whose feet this earth dark valley trod  
that so it might be bright.

Our hopes are weak, our fears are strong  
thick darkness blinds our eyes:  
cold is the night, and oh we long  
that you, our sun would rise.

And even now, though dull and grey  
the East is brightening fast.  
And kindling to the perfect day  
that never shall be past.

Oh guide us till our path is done  
and we have reached the shore  
Where you, our everlasting sun  
Are shining ever more.

I wish you all a very happy Sunday with your families  
a very happy and holy Christmas.

The total cost of this essential project is £31,213.00. The work will be completed in February 2018 by Anglian Windows and comes with a ten year guarantee.
