CONTINUING THE ENCYCLICAL LETTER OF THE SUPREME PONTIFF FRANCIS

THE LIGHT OF FAITH - CONTINUED

CHAPTER ONE

11. A final element of the story of Abraham is important for understanding his faith. God's word, while bringing new-ness and surprise, is not at all alien to Abraham's experience. In the voice which speaks to him, the patriarch recognises a profound call which was always present at the core of his being. God ties his promise to that aspect of human life which has always appeared most "full of promise," namely, parenthood, the begetting of new life: "Sarah your wife shall bear you a son, and you shall name him Isaac" (Gen 17:19). The God who asks Abraham for complete trust reveals himself to be the source of all life. Faith is thus linked to God's fatherhood, which gives rise to all creation; the God who calls Abraham is the Creator, the one who "calls into existence the things that do not exist" (Rom 4:17), the one who "chose us before the foundation of the world . . . and destined us for adoption as his children" (Eph 1:4-5). For Abraham, faith in God sheds light on the depths of his being, it enables him to acknowledge the well-spring of goodness at the origin of all things and to realize that his life is not the product of non-being or chance, but the fruit of a personal call and a personal love. The mysterious God who called him is no alien deity, but the God who is the origin and mainstay of all that is. The great test of Abraham's faith, the sacrifice of his son Isaac, would show the extent to which this primordial love is capable of ensuring life even beyond death. The word which could raise up a son to one who was "as good as dead," in "the barrenness" of Sarah's womb (cf. Rom 4:19), can also stand by his promise of a future beyond all threat or danger (cf. Heb 11:19; Rom 4:21).

Fr. Leslie writes

Welcome to St Joseph's and especially those who are visiting us for the first time. Today, the 30th Sunday of the year, we hear how Jesus spent a large part of his ministry

combating the self-righteousness of the Pharisees. In the parable today, he addresses their behaviour head on but with a sense of humour. One of the problems with the Pharisees was their simplistic approach to their religion. They fasted, they prayed, they gave to good causes. It was in their nature to do these things. Their hearts, however, were far away from God. Everything was an outward show. Perhaps the Pharisee in the parable should have examined his conscience to see where he had made the wrong choices. He would then have seen that he was in need of God's grace as a protection from sin and darkness. He would have thanked God for the grateful heart.

However the broken, crushed tax collector adopted the position of the true disciple of Jesus. His prayer is the prayer of all penitents, that of repentance with hearts full of praise, thanks and gratitude.

As we move shortly into the Advent season, we can reflect on which of the two do our lives revolve around, the Pharisee, or the tax collector? May we learn from Jesus that we all saved by grace and justified by the mercy of Jesus.

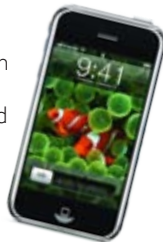
