Recommendations

"I know him in whom I have believed" (2 Tm 1:12)

These words of St Paul help us to understand that faith is "first of all a personal adherence of man to God. At the same time, and inseparably, it is a free assent to the whole truth that God has revealed". Faith which is a personal trust in the Lord and the faith which we profess in the Creed are inseparable; they focus on each other and they require each other. There exists a profound bond between the lived faith and its contents. The faith of the Witnesses and Confessors is also the faith of the Apostles and Doctors of the Church.

Thus, the following recommendations for the Year of Faith desire to aid both the encounter with Christ through authentic witnesses to faith, and the ever-greater understanding of its contents. These proposals are intended as examples to encourage a ready response to the invitation of the Holy Father to live fully this Year as a special "time of grace". The joyous rediscovery of faith can also contribute to consolidate the unity and communion among the different bodies that make up the wider family of the Church.

Welcome to all our parishioners and especially to new parishioners. We hope you all have a good week.

Today the fifth Sunday of Easter the reading from the Acts of the

Apostles is very practical. It is about real places that is why Luke names them so conscientiously. Paul and Barnabas are going about setting up church structures and encouraging people in these churches. These are actual communities where the Gospel has to be lived, and that requires organisation and practical action. Christians live in a complex world made up of human beings with their foibles and weaknesses, and in order to live as a community, and in the wider community, there needs to be order. But of course, that is not enough for the church is not simply a human society.

In the gospel Luke sets the early church's story before us so that we can make it our story. He celebrates our forebears zeal, fidelity and courage to arouse our zeal, test our fidelity and challenge our witness. Moreover, the community – stabilising structures Paul and Barnabas established in those cities, are ones we rely on still.

For us Jesus's new commandment to us is to love one another as he has loved us. In a world that seems to be marked more and more by intolerance and suspicion, following this command can seem to be extraordinarily difficult. As we move through our celebration, let us pray to our loving God to inspire in our hearts a deep and abiding love for everyone in our world.

**MY RCIA JOURNEY** by Lisa Thompson

*I have always felt as though I have been guided through the important parts of life. My journey into faith really started 10 years ago when my daughter started at St. Joseph the Worker school. She was fortunate enough to be taught by Joan Williams who quickly became very dear to me. I helped out with the children in class and when the teaching assistant broke a leg, I took her place for a few terms. In this time I got to witness how Joan taught the children about Jesus and the catholic faith. I was so taken by it that I had my daughter baptised. Joan's simplistic approach and un-questionable faith was catching and I wanted to be part of the church as a result. I supported my daughter in her journey to make her first communion and found I learnt so much along the way. I loved the whole catholic ethos and what it stood for. A year and a half ago I had a son. It was at this time in which I realised how important converting was to me because of how much I wanted him to be baptised. It was an overwhelming feeling. I met with Father Leslie and he suggested I join the next RCIA course. As the initial meeting became closer, I did harbour some doubt as to whether I could fully commit myself and live my every day life as a catholic. I really needn't have worried though, the meetings were both educational and insightful, I looked forward to each and every session. Gaye, my sponsor and the catechists were brilliant, they answered any questions or concerns, and shared their personal experiences freely. Being on the course with Katie and Nikki was wonderful and their input was invaluable to me. I could feel myself changing as we progressed, I would second think my actions and question motives. This became stronger after I attended the RCIA mass at the Cathedral and met the Bishop. There were so many other people from all over Brentwood diocese being received into the church and it dawned on me then how privileged we all were to be sharing something so special. I had a similar feeling at the reconciliation service at the Cathedral. I had been thinking non stop about what I was going to say in my first confession and was apprehensive. The service was wonderful and I found myself reduced to tears as relief overwhelmed me. I got so much from that experience. It made me feel ready to be received into the church and take the Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. That evening will stay with me forever, I felt so special and honoured to be finally confirmed into the Catholic faith. I am now a much calmer person and at peace with myself, this is due to praying and leaving my problems and anxieties in the Lords hands. There is so much to learn and I still get confused at times in mass, but I know that this is a life time of learning and spiritual progression which excites me no end!*
