

Journey Home (continued)

Jesus is the Bread of Life and is really and truly present in the Eucharist. Does the Eucharist nourish and feed your faith? Do you hunger to receive it? Or has receiving Holy Communion become simply a habit or empty ritual? Today's Gospel is similar to John 4, where Jesus is in dialogue with the woman at the well about water, whereas today he's in conversation with the people about bread. Jesus wants to lead and encourage us to realise our deeper need for what is spiritual, and to open our eyes to see that it is Jesus himself who fulfils our deepest needs. Initially, it seems that Jesus is there to miraculously supply an earthly need. He has just fed thousands of people through a multiplication of bread and fish. He also claimed to be able to give the woman at the well so much water that she would never thirst again.

The people clearly recognised the miracle – they even suspected that there was something miraculous about the way that Jesus had crossed the lake. However, they failed to recognise who Jesus really is. They asked if Jesus was greater than Moses, who provided bread (manna) for thousands of Israelites during their many years of wandering in the desert. The woman asked if Jesus was greater than Jacob, who provided a continuous source of water from a well. The manna in the desert and the water from Jacob's well point to the gift of the Eucharist.
