Welcome to our parish news of St. Joseph the Worker 23 March 2025

This week we celebrated the Feast of St Joseph. Although our parish is dedicated to him under a different title, it is still the same St Joseph! In the great drama of our redemption, where angels sang and the Virgin conceived, where shepherds knelt and kings offered gold, there stood a silent figure-his name is Joseph.

St Joseph, the just man, was chosen not for his words, but for his silence, not for his power, but for his obedience. In a world clamouring for recognition and limitless autonomy, he sought only to do the will of God. He was the shadow cast by the heavenly Father upon the earth, protecting the Light of the world before that Light could speak, defend, or even walk.

The world around us does not understand such greatness because it seeks strength in noise, wisdom in argument, and authority in coercion. But Joseph's strength lay in his forgetfulness of himself, his wisdom in listening, his authority in surrender. When the angel commanded, he did not hesitate; when the Child was in danger, he did not falter and when the hidden years stretched before him, he did not complain.

Joseph is the saint for our times because he teaches that holiness is not found in grand gestures, but in quiet fidelity, not in conquest, but in trust. The greatest miracles of God are often placed in the hands of those who do not seek them. And so, in the carpenter's home, the Son of God was raised, and the Savior of the world called a humble, working man His

May we, like Joseph, embrace the hidden will of God, knowing that the truest greatness is not in being seen, but in standing faithfully in the shadow of the Divine.

Wednesday 12 March - Monday 21 April at St George's Cathedral Lambeth Road Southwark SE1

St George's Cathedral is open - Monday-Friday from 7:15am-5pm, Saturday from 9am-7pm, and Sunday from 7:30am-7pm.

The Shroud of Turin is a length of linen cloth that bears a faint image of the front & back of a crucified man - believed by many to be the actual burial Shroud used to wrap the body of Our Lord after his crucifixion, & upon which his bodily image is miraculously imprinted.
