Welcome to our parish news of St. Joseph the Worker 3 November 2024

This week we celebrated All Saints and All Souls-the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed. These two days bring us into November which is marked as always by our consideration of eternal life in a more profound way. It makes sense. As the year draws to its close and the foliage of nature begins to fall, so too we are invited to consider the Four Last Things - Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell. All Saints allows us to reflect on the fact that we are created not for this life, but for the next - for a life in Heaven with God and His Saints. All Souls reminds us that God, in His mercy, recognises fragility and so gives us time beyond death to make the final preparations to enter into his presence. Most of us will not be ready immediately after death to enter into the presence of God. Most of us recognise that we are not saints yet! This time beyond death is what we as Catholics know as Purgatory. This is why we pray for our dead.

During November we customarily keep the memories of our Beloved Dead in our prayers. Their names can be placed in the envelopes at the back of the church, along with an offering or donation if you can. These names will be remembered here at St Joseph's throughout November in our Masses and our daily prayers, and their names recorded in the Book of Remembrance. In this way, we present them to God our loving father. Visiting a place of burial—or cemetery—is a custom at this time where you might think of pausing to pray for your loved ones. Please also do not forget to pray for those who have no loved ones left on earth. It is a wonderful act of love to pray for the Holy Souls, especially those who have nobody to pray for them. Fr.
