# Welcome to our parish news of St. Joseph the Worker 16 February 2025

Can you be a Christian and not believe in the Resurrection? St Paul gives us the answer in the second reading, and it is a resounding 'no.' It makes no sense. He goes on to explain why. If Christ has not risen, then what would the point be? If Christ had not risen, we would still be slaves to sin and death. It is only because Christ has risen that we know what God the Father has promised to us - eternal life. Our hope in this is founded upon our belief in Christ's resurrection from the dead. There is no getting around this point. St Paul, this Sunday especially, makes that very clear.

In other words, we cannot set aside the more mystical aspects of our belief to focus solely on the good works that Christians do. The Church is not just another charitable organisation. The Church does wonderful things in communities all across the world. The Church feeds, clothes, houses, cares for, and medical treats, more people than any other institution on the planet. But this is not what defines us. All of these good work's flow from our relationship with the Lord who calls each of us to some definite form of service.
