

## **JOURNEY HOME: (continued)**

Other than the Sermon on the Mount (which contains the Beatitudes) Jesus taught chiefly through parables. In doing this he revealed the profoundly human fascination with the power of a story. We all like a good story, don't we? They capture not just our imaginations but also our hearts.

The parable of the growing seed captures the generous and lavish work of God's grace in our lives because God (who is the Sower) spreads his grace lavishly and generously. To understand the Sower's seed, we have to cultivate a radical approach to baptism, for the grace we received at baptism is the seed, always at work in us night and day, whether asleep or awake.

## First Holy Communion 24/25 Year 4 From September.

First Holy Communion Application Forms are available only after Sunday Mass from Fr. Leslie. The conditions to prepare for this Sacrament is that the family and children attend Mass over the weekends (it is one of the commandments that we have to observe). If your child belongs to another parish then they have to apply to their parish.

You will be expected to attend the parent's evening and your child will have to attend their induction on the Saturday mornings. Should you miss two of the meetings then you will need to reflect that you and your child may not be ready, and you may need to postpone.

The parent's introductory evening will be on Wednesday 17 July.

The programme begins in September. All applications must be in by 17 July and everything will be explained about the preparation course

## The New Lectionary

The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part for the continuing process of revising liturgy translation. The process began with the Roman mesial 0011 and has continued with all the text. The new Lectionary will use both the English Standard Version – Catholic Edition of the Bible and the ABBEY Psalter for the psalms. The Lectionary will become mandatory for use from Advent 2024.

The Cost: £695 (4 VOLUME SET). EACH set comes with four STICKERS that can be inscribed with the names of those who donate to The New Liturgical books on behalf of Their Parish
