## Welcome to our parish news of St. Joseph the Worker 2 February 2025

I never know when it is no longer appropriate to wish people a Happy New Year. One week after? Two weeks after? The end of the month definitely seems too late. While it would not be right to wish our neighbours a Happy New Year at this time, it would be entirely appropriate to wish them a Happy Christmas. Today is the great feast of the Presentation of the Lord, also known as Candlemas. It marks the end of the Christmas Season and forty days after Christmas Day itself. The Presentation of the Lord means the presentation of the child Jesus in the temple in Jerusalem by Our Lady and St Joseph, fulfilling the requirements of the Law of Moses which set out that all the first born should be 'redeemed' with a sacrifice at the temple.

In this way we have kept up our crib until this weekend, marking the character of the season, even as the Advent wreath and Christmas tree have been taken down. It serves to remind us of the ever-abiding beauty of the Incarnation. And perhaps a reminder that is now only 37 days until Lent!

To celebrate the occasion our wonderful school choir is singing at the 5.30 Mass on Saturday and the first gathering of our new parish choir will be taking place at the 10.30. It takes a long time to build up music in a parish and so I wanted to start as soon as I arrived. Thank you for your support in helping to make our celebrations of the Mass reverent, worthy, and as beautiful as possible.

You will have noticed this weekend that our new contactless card machine has arrived. I am always touched by the generosity of the people of St Joseph's, and I hope this will provide another, and more convenient way, to continue to support the parish. The set-up is not completely finished but in the coming weeks it will be possible to gift-aid donations through the machine and to donate to specific projects. It will also be possible to purchase tickets for social events, and make donations for Mass intentions, baptisms and weddings.
