

Welcome to our parish news of St. Joseph the Worker 2 March 2025 Foodbank Collection

Lent will soon be upon us, and it is a good idea to think about what we might want to do before it actually arrives. Lent is a time to draw closer to God through fasting, almsgiving, and prayer. These are not just external practices which we should feel obliged to take on but essential expressions of the Christian life.

Fasting is not just a form of self-denial but also a way to strengthen the spirit. Fasting helps to purify the soul, turning our focus away from earthly desires and redirecting it to God. Fasting, in this sense, is a form of spiritual warfare, enabling Christians to resist temptation and grow in virtue. As we fast, we mirror Christ's own fasting in the desert, which was his own preparation for the beginning of His public ministry. What do you enjoy that you would be willing to give up for 40 days?

Almsgiving is a manifestation of Christ's love for the poor and needy. We remember the words of St Augustine, 'The measure of love is to love without measure,' encouraging Christians to give generously, not out of obligation, but out of a deep love for Christ and neighbour. Could Lent be an opportunity for you to share the material blessings you have received with those in need? Is there a charity you could support? Could you support our parish a little more in this season? Is there someone who you know to be in need?

Finally, prayer is the raising of our heart and mind to God. Prayer is the foundation of our relationship with God, the source of all virtue, and is, alongside the sacraments, the means by which we receive grace. Lent is a time to deepen our prayer life, drawing near to God and cultivating our friendship with Him. It is through prayer that we are reminded of God's presence in our lives and are empowered to live out the virtues of fasting and almsgiving with the right disposition. Could you give a little more time to prayer this Lent? Could you come to an extra Mass in the week? Could you find the time to come to Stations of the Cross?

Together, these practices prepare us for the Paschal Mystery-Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection-by helping us to die to ourselves and live more fully in His grace.
