#### Welcome to our parish news of St. Joseph the Worker 26 January 2025

The 25th January is the Feast of the conversion of St Paul. He began his career as one of the Church's most vicious persecuted. He finished it as one of the Church's most gifted and celebrated missionaries, giving his own life for Christ who saved him from a life of error and misguided hatred.

Thinking about conversion in hindsight can sometimes make the 'time before' seem as though it were time wasted. But that same consideration in hindsight can help us to see God's grace at work even in the mistakes and sins of our past. God doesn't make us sin, but He is able to bring good out of bad situations. A series of even the most unfortunate events can bring someone to the point where they are ready to say 'yes' to God and all He wants to do through them and for them. This should be a source of encouragement for all of us, whether or not we feel we have a lot to make up for. God will make things right. And He will do so simply because He loves us.

This Love prompted God the Father to send His only Son into the world to redeem it. This love transformed that world. This love was what Our Lord sent the disciples out into the world to preach. This love transformed St Paul's life forever. And, perhaps on a smaller scale, it can transform us too. We can know about Christ's love more deeply. We can be inspired by that same love. We too can be a small link in a chain of unlikely and/or spectacular events that can bring someone else to the point of saying 'yes' to God and His love.

May St Paul pray for us all. May God bless you this coming week. Amen. Fr. Gary
