Mission Today



JOURNEY HOME: (continued)

Jesus was in good company when he taught: "So whatever you wish that men would do to you, do so to them; for this is the law and the prophets" (v.12). For the Greek philosophers taught along similar lines, for example: "Avoid doing what you would blame others for doing" (Thales); "Do not do to others what would anger you if done to you by others" (Isocrates); "What thou avoidest sufferings thyself seek not to impose on others" (Epictetus).

We love and care for others how we would want to be loved and cared for ourselves. Jesus' teaching wasn't re-inventing the wheel. He was building on a teaching already incorporated into the natural law. It is within our nature, our own natural powers, to treat others well, to be kind, respectful and well mannered. The Law and the Prophets pointed to this, and in Jesus' mind this way of behaving or living is a summation of the entire Law and the Prophets.

However, we are to go beyond the Law and the Prophets. We are witness to the life in the Spirit, which is a life of power and of grace which goes far beyond the natural law. We are witness to a quality of love which the world seldom sees. We are witness to a kind of love which melts hearts, moves mountains, and overcomes all manner of hatred and evil. If we simply do to others as we would have them do to us, what reward should we expect?

Leslie to explain the preparations that are necessary for First Communion children and their families. The meeting will be on Wednesday 17 July at 8.00 p.m. in the Parish Hall. All Application forms should be completed by then and handed in.

The conditions to prepare for this Sacrament are that the family and children attend Mass over the weekends (it is one of the commandments that we have to observe). If your child belongs to another parish then they have to apply to that parish. You will be expected to attend the parent's evening and your child will have to attend their induction on the Saturday mornings. Should you miss two of the meetings then you will need to reflect that you and your child may not be ready, and you may need to postpone. The programme begins in September. All applications must be in by 17 July and everything will be explained about the preparation course
