Cardinal calls for an hour of prayer for the dignity of human life

There is currently a bill before Parliament which would legalise euthanasia. Concerns have been raised about the lack of safeguarding towards the most vulnerable. The experience of the Netherlands, Belgium, and Canada have shown horrific cases of patients being pressured into consent, or of legal drugs being administered without proper consent. The Bishops of England and Wales have urged Catholics to spend an hour of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament to pray that this legislation will be defeated. St Joseph's is open all day and we have our time of adoration on Saturdays 10.30-11.15am. The Cathedral has a Holy Hour on Monday evenings from 6.30-7.30pm. Please also consider writing to our local MP to voice your opposition to this bill.
